In accordance with Title 9-B MRSA §217, as amended, I am submitting to the members of the Maine House and Senate a report entitled "The Status of Maine's Financial Institutions."

This report contains the number, type and legal structure of all financial institutions operating in the State of Maine, as well as the location of offices and total deposits held by these institutions. Maine's financial institutions continued to show improvement in earnings and capital ratios for 1995.

The future course of the financial services industry will be shaped by recent changes in state and federal interstate bank branching laws. Governor King established a Task Force to study the issue of interstate banking and branching in Maine and draft legislation in response to changes in federal law. The Task Force completed its assignment at yearend, and its recommendations are summarized in Section III of this report. The Governor plans to propose legislation to implement the Task Forces's recommendations for the Second Regular Session of the 117th Maine Legislature.

Copies of this report have been distributed to the Secretary of the State Senate in order to provide one copy for each member of the Senate. The report will also be available in electronic format on the Maine Bureau of Banking's World Wide Web Home Page at "hhp://www.state.me.us/pfr/bkg/status96.htm".
