Senator GOLDTHMAIT: Thank you, Mr. President. I feel compelled to speak briefly to this bill for a couple of reasons. One is that it seems to me that it is more likely to reinforce the sense that money carries the day in elections, because it provides the candidate with the opportunity to sign up for the voluntary pledge to limit spending, but also the opportunity to change their mind if their opponent does not sign up to do the same thing and withdraw that pledge, in which case the list of who did and who didn't would be corrected and redistributed, making it extremely difficult for voters to know who actually pledged to do it and who didn't. The other issue for me in this bill is, if my understanding of the bill is correct, is that it will allow members of political parties to spend twice the amount as non-members of political parties; because I understand that it refers to the primary and the

final election as separate elections, thereby allowing party members twice the exposure of unenrolled candidates. Therefore, I will be voting against this bill and I would request a Division. Thank you.

Senator GOLDTHMAIT of Hancock requested a
