The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Windham, Representative Kontos who wishes to speak on the record.

Representative KONTOS: Madam Speaker, Men and Women of the House. I have the great opportunity again this year to introduce to you the 1998 Maine Kids Count Data Book produced by the Maine Children's Alliance. It is being distributed to you quite soon. As policy makers, we are asked to focus on this problem or that and to create new programs or to fix existing ones. What we do not always get, however, is reliable factual data to help us shape priorities and make our decisions. That is why the Kids Count Book is so special and why the data is such useful tools for you and for all of us who care so much about protecting our most precious resource, Maine's children.

Last year you heard me tell you that it was probably one of the most valuable resources to me, of all of those that I received during my legislative sessions. I think you will find that to be true again this year. This will be the fourth addition of the Maine Kids Count Data Book. It will provide to you extensive information regarding the manner in which many children in Maine access health care services. The focus brings attention to child care

health issues during what could be a major turning point in health care policy and in the provision of providing health services to children in Maine. It also provides the most up-to-date facts and information regarding how Maine children are fairing in other areas such as social and economic opportunity, education, community and family environment, physical and mental health. You will find, as I do, that the information is presented in a way that is easy for you to use. You will find data that is both statewide and also broken down by county. Some of the facts clearly show us areas that we have worked on and have improved. Others, regrettably, indicate a greater need for us to work together to protect all of Maine's children.

The facts show us that many families of children in Maine have all that they need to live healthy, happy lives during this period of economic prosperity in Maine. As the economy improves in Maine, however, the percentage of jobs, which you will see in one of the charts, that pay a livable wage, continues to decrease. There are too many children living in families who go without two meals a day, go without appropriate shelter, go without necessary health care and other basic needs. Many parents in these families work hard, but at jobs that do not provide enough to meet the day to day needs of their children. These parents need our support to ensure that their children remain healthy, safe and worry free. No child should ever have to worry about where their next meal is coming from or being too cold to sleep at night. No parent should have to worry about the pain a child is experiencing because they don't know if they should go to the doctor since they can't pay the bill.

While these worries may seem unreal to many of us, they exist as too many Maine kids fall into a widening gap. As this gap widens, more families find themselves living on the edge, walking on eggshells, waiting for some mishap that could plunge them into devastation. Each of you may look at this book as individual indicators or look at county data and arrive at your own conclusions about how best to address the concerns expressed by those numbers. What matters to the Maine Children's Alliance and to those of us who have supported their efforts over the years, is that you use this information to determine how best to serve the needs of Maine's children. Most importantly, that all of us recognize that behind every number in this book are the real faces of Maine's children and their families. As you look through the books, which I see now you have before you, something that I hope you have the occasion to do frequently throughout the session and once we go home. You will notice that no where does this book attempt to tell us what we should do or what we must do. Rather, each and every page, each and every statistic, gives us information which I found I can't locate anywhere else, that all of us can use to make important decisions that we are entrusted to make.

I know I speak for all those folks who have worked on this publication and for members of the Maine Children's Alliance in giving you what I believe will be a most valuable resource. We thank the young people who helped distribute it to you today. Thank you Madam Speaker.
