THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Cathcart.

Senator **CATHCART**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. I rise just to say a few words about this supplemental budget, which I hope you will all support with me.

As you recall, last November the 120th Legislature met in Special Session and enacted a supplemental budget to balance the budget for this fiscal year, fiscal year 2003. As you all well know, our state constitution requires that we have a balanced budget. This budget does balance the budget for now. It includes curtailments, about half of it is curtailments that were ordered by former-Governor King. He worked with the new Governor, Governor Baldacci, to make recommendations for the remainder of this budget. It doesn't include any lay-offs or cuts to people with mental illness or some of the more vulnerable citizens. It does make some deep appropriations, some cuts, some transfers from Federal funds and other special revenues and includes the curtailments that were enacted already by Governor King.

I think what is important to me, about passing this budget, is that the Appropriations Committee voted unanimously in favor of the budget and I hope that all of us in the Senate will be able to do the same thing. It is a way that we can send the message, very strongly, to the people of Maine that this Senate and this 121st Legislature intend to work together, as hard as we can, to be fiscally responsible and to provide a balanced budget for all the people of Maine. Thank you, Madame President.
