JOINT RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BATH LODGE OF ELKS

WHEREAS, the Bath Lodge of Elks, B.P.O.E. #934, was established on November 11, 1904 by the famous Maine writer of that era, Holman F. Day, who was then District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler of Maine West. The Lewiston Lodge of Elks and officers from the Lewiston, Waterville and Portland lodges organized and installed the first officers of the Bath Lodge on this date; and

WHEREAS, the Bath Lodge's first home was on the Huse property on Lambard Street, where it remained until 1967, when the Lodge purchased the Torrey Roller Brush Factory property, which was renovated and remodeled to become the Lodge's present home; and

WHEREAS, in 1907, the Bath Lodge of Elks was incorporated as a charitable organization and became the Mother Lodge of the newly established Rockland Lodge of Elks; and

WHEREAS, the Bath Lodge of Elks is part of the greatest and largest fraternal organization in the United States, with almost 2,200 local lodges and 1.3 million members dedicated to the Principles of Elkdom: Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; and

WHEREAS, each year the Bath Lodge of Elks grew and gained membership so that, by the 75th anniversary of the Lodge, there were approximately 1,000 members. In 1994 membership was opened to women; and

WHEREAS, over the 100 years of its existence, the Bath Lodge of Elks has contributed major funds to the community, including funds for the new Bath Memorial Hospital, which was also presented with an Iron Lung and furnished with a private room and a semiprivate room in the hospital; and
