Dear President Edmonds and Speaker Richardson,

Pursuant to MRSA Title 29-A, Section 460, the Secretary of State is charged with providing specially designed motor vehicle registration plates for members of the Legislature. Further, MRSA Title 29-A, Section 460, Paragraph 4 states: "The Secretary of State shall determine the color, shape, size, lettering and numbering of the official registration plates...." As you know, beginning with the 122nd Legislature, a new design was effected.

There have been a number of concerns expressed about the new design; that it is not distinctive, and that it is difficult to differentiate the Legislative plate from standard-issue designs of other states. Further, the numbers are difficult to read at a distance, a difficulty exacerbated by normal soiling associated with winter driving. Given these and other difficulties, I have made the determination that the new design will be discontinued. The official legislative plate is not a vanity plate; indeed, it is an important portal for inviting citizen engagement with members of the Legislature as they travel around their districts and the entire state. The current design has not satisfied that function.

By March 1st, 2005, my office will issue registration plates similar to the style that has been traditionally produced. By March 15th, the plates that were issued beginning December 1st, 2004, will no longer be valid for use. Members may retain possession of them. A one-time replacement fee of \$2.00 will be assessed members for administrative costs associated with issuance of the replacement plate.
