Senator **MILLS**: Madame President, the sole purpose of this is to correct a wording error. Actually, the committee had voted to propose the amendment as amended by this Senate Amendment S-12 that I am presenting now. There is a grammatical flaw in the bill as it has come up to us to the floor. I think since we are trying to amend the Constitution of the State of Maine and these words are likely to undergo considerable public scrutiny and if the amendment passes those words will persist for perhaps many generations to come. My 88-year-old mother, who is an English teacher, would have not let me not make this proposed amendment or change. She taught me sentence diagramming when I was in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade and the way this was originally worded just didn't diagram properly. If you vote to put this amendment on the bill, I think it will please her a great deal. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Gagnon.

Senator **GAGNON**: Thank you, Madame President. I would encourage folks to adopt this amendment. We found out just a little while ago that it's not a correction that can be made later since it is an amendment to the Constitution. Thank you.
