# JOINT RESOLUTION REQUESTING MAINE'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUBMIT LEGISLATION TO SECURE THE CONSENT OF CONGRESS REGARDING GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTIONS

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-second Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Maine Congressional Delegation as follows:

WHEREAS, the State of Maine has signed the 2001 New England Governors and Eastern Canadian Premiers Climate Change Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Climate Change Action Plan requires greater coordination of common strategies for the resolution of energy issues to achieve the goal to reduce the effects of climate change; and

WHEREAS, the State of Maine has passed legislation to implement the greenhouse gas reduction goals of that agreement; and

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution, Article 1, Section 10 forbids such agreements without the consent of the United States Congress; and

WHEREAS, litigation challenging the State of Maine's implementation of the climate change agreement would damage efforts to reduce the harmful effects of greenhouse gas emissions; and

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to request that the Maine Congressional Delegation submit legislation to the United States Congress to secure the consent necessary for the State of Maine to proceed with its commitment to the 2001 New England Governors and Eastern Canadian Premiers Climate Change Action Plan; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE PRESIDENT AND CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO SUPPORT THE REFORM OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY OFFSETS OF THE GOVERNMENT PENSION OFFSET AND THE WINDFALL ELIMINATION PROVISION

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-second Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the President of the United States and the United States Congress as follows:

WHEREAS, under current federal law, individuals who receive a Social Security benefit and a public retirement benefit derived from employment not covered under Social Security are subject to a reduction in the Social Security benefits; and

WHEREAS, these laws, contained in the federal Social Security Act, 42 United States Code, Chapter 7, Subchapter II, Federal Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance Benefits,

and known as the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision, greatly affect public employees, particularly women; and

WHEREAS, the Windfall Elimination Provision reduces by a formula the Social Security benefit of a person who is also receiving a pension from a public employer that does not participate in Social Security; and

WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision are particularly burdensome on the finances of low-income and moderate-income public service workers, such as school teachers, clerical workers and school cafeteria employees, whose wages are low to start; and

WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision both unfairly reduce benefits for those public employees and their spouses whose careers cross the line between the private and public sectors; and

WHEREAS, since many lower-paying public service jobs are held by women, both the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision have a disproportionately adverse effect on women; and

WHEREAS, in some cases, additional support in the form of income, housing, heating and prescription drug and other safety net assistance from state and local governments is needed to make up for the reductions imposed at the federal level; and

WHEREAS, other participants in Social Security do not have their benefits reduced in this manner; and

WHEREAS, to participate or not to participate in Social Security in public sector employment is a decision of employers, even though both the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision directly punish employees and their spouses; and

WHEREAS, although the Government Pension Offset was enacted in 1977 and the Windfall Elimination Provision was enacted in 1983, many of the benefits in dispute were paid into Social Security prior to that time; and

WHEREAS, bills are present in Congress in both the House of Representatives and the Senate, known as "The Social Security Fairness Acts," that would amend the federal Social Security Act, 42 United States Code, Chapter 7, Subchapter II and totally repeal both the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, request that the President of the United States and the United States Congress work together to support reform proposals that include the following protections for low-income and moderate-income government retirees:

- 1. Protections permitting retention of a combined public pension and Social Security benefit with no applied reductions;
- 2. Protections permanently ensuring that level of benefits by indexing it to inflation; and

3. Protections ensuring that no current recipient's benefit is reduced by the reform legislation; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United States; the President of the United States Senate; the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States; and each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

### JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE BATH MASONIC LODGE ON THE OCCASION OF ITS BICENTENNIAL

WHEREAS, before Maine achieved statehood and 75 years before Bath became a city, the Solar Lodge 14 of the Order of Free and Accepted Masons was established; and

WHEREAS, the order was founded many centuries earlier in Europe as a labor organization for masons, stone craftsman and others who designed and built the great cathedrals of Europe; and

WHEREAS, the tradition was brought to America by colonists who were active Masons, including Paul Revere, Benjamin Franklin and George Washington; and

WHEREAS, the ancient democratic systems of freemasonry came to Bath, then known as "The Reach," in 1804 when the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts chartered Solar Lodge on September 10, 1804; and

WHEREAS, William King was elected as the first master of the lodge and later became the first Governor of Maine in 1820 when Maine became a state under the Missouri Compromise and then became Grand Master of Masons in Maine that same year; and

WHEREAS, the first meetings were held at Winship's Hall, where the current Maxwell's Restaurant stands, and later meetings were held at various locations around Bath until the Masons built their own Masonic Temple in 1911; and WHEREAS, in 1921, with about 400 Masons in attendance, the cornerstone was laid for the current temple at the former McClennan Mansion, which is now shared with other Masonic bodies, including the Polar Star Lodge; and

WHEREAS, Solar Lodge is now celebrating its 200th Anniversary with 120 members, all working the degrees in the traditional custom; and

WHEREAS, from its origin as a labor organization, the Masons have developed into a fraternal society, where membership is distinguished based on strength of character and willingness to continually refine those qualities that serve society; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-second Legislature now assembled on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to extend our congratulations to the good members of Solar Lodge 14 of the Order of Free and Accepted Masons on this bicentennial celebration and our best wishes for future success; and be it further
