ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Study Commission on Cumberland County Regionalization is established as follows.

- 1. Study Commission on Cumberland County
 Regionalization established. The Study Commission on
 Cumberland County Regionalization, referred to in this order as
 "the study commission," is established to study and make
 recommendations on regional delivery of services in Cumberland
 County.
- 2. Membership. The study commission consists of the following 6 members:
 - A. Two members of the Senate from Cumberland County, appointed by the President of the Senate, including one from each major political party; and
 - B. Four members of the House of Representatives from Cumberland County, appointed by the Speaker of the House, including 2 from each major political party.
- Study commission cochairs. The first-named Senator is the Senate chair of the study commission and the first-named member of the House is the House chair of the study commission.
- 4. Appointments; convening of study commission. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following passage of this order. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the study commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the study commission, which may be no later than September 15, 2005.
 - 5. Duties. The study commission:
 - A. Shall undertake a regionalization study with regard to 4 areas: water districts, waste systems, bus and transportation systems and emergency services dispatch systems;
 - B. Shall include all public and quasi-public entities and nonprofit corporations formed pursuant to law currently providing services in Cumberland County in the 4 areas to be studied:
 - C. Shall consider establishing county departments for water districts, regional waste systems and bus and transportation systems and a regional dispatch center within the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office and shall consider transferring to the county the applicable assets and debts

associated with the delivery of these services to the county's communities;

- D. Shall evaluate the Portland Water District and other water districts within the county and the private and special and public laws applicable to water districts. The study commission shall propose establishing a county water district as a department of county government with governance by a board of trustees appointed by the county commissioners;
- E. Shall evaluate existing regional waste systems that serve Cumberland County and York County and all laws applicable to waste systems, including the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1304-B and the Maine Refuse Disposal District Enabling Act. The study commission shall propose establishing a county waste management authority as a department of county government with governance provided by a board of trustees appointed by the county commissioners:
- F. Shall evaluate the Greater Portland Transit District, the South Portland Bus Service, the Regional Transportation Program and the Casco Bay Island Transit District and all-laws pertinent to buses and transportation. The study commission shall propose establishing a bus and transportation systems agency as a department of county government with governance provided by a board of trustees appointed by the county commissioners; and
- G. Shall evaluate the existing dispatch centers for emergency services. The study commission shall propose establishing a regional dispatch center or centers as a division of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office.
- Staff assistance. The Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the study commission.
- 7. Compensation. Legislative members of the study commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the study commission.
- 8. Report. No later than January 1, 2006, the study commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government and the Legislative Council. The study commission is not authorized to introduce legislation. Following receipt and review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature.
- Extension. If the study commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension. Upon submission of its required report, the study commission terminates.
- 10. Budget. The chairs of the study commission, with assistance from the study commission staff, shall administer the study commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the study commission shall present a work plan and proposed

budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The study commission may not incur expenses that would result in the study commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the study commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the study commission chairs and staff with a status report on the study commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Perry.

Senator PERRY: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I hope you will follow my lead and accept the Ought Not to Pass Report on L.D. 593. An Act to Alter Trade-In Allowances Regarding Motor Homes. Basically, what it is that when you trade your car in at a dealership, you receive a trade-in tax credit for the value of that traded-in vehicle. So if you buy a \$20,000 car with a \$10,000 trade-in, you pay sales tax on \$10,000. It's the same with motor homes and campers. However, where the disparity is when if you trade a pop-up camper for a fifth wheel, or a fifth wheel for a motor home, where you are moving between classes, there is no trade-in credit. This bill would seek to extend the trade-in credit regardless of what category you trade-in from or two. I have, I think, the biggest motor home dealer in the state in my district. I see the guy on a regular basis. He's never addressed this with me. Doesn't seem to be an issue. The majority report, I think, wants to address an inconsistency, as they see it, in Maine law. I would argue that the only thing consistent about our tax code is the inconsistencies. If we address them one at a time, we would adjourn in October or November. I there may be a way to address this. I don't think it's

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on this freestanding bill. It's not an issue that anyone's ever brought to my attention, including the dealer. I hope we will kill this bill. Thank you.
