**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator ROSEN: Thank you, Madame President and members of the Senate. The bill that is before us has been changed. The majority report and the amendment is now the bill. It is now a resolve that directs the Department of Health and Human Services to begin to involve itself in the realm of clinical trials of pharmaceutical testing for the development of pharmaceutical drugs on a worldwide basis. It requires that the Department of Health and Human Services shall study the accessibility of information regarding the results of certain clinical trials of pharmaceuticals, treatment options, medical devices, and the enrollment of certain persons in those trials. The study must include a review of registration of clinical trials with a website developed by the National Library of Medicine as a service to the United States National Institutes of Health and human volunteers and access to the results of those trials for physicians, healthcare providers, and the public.

Ladies and gentlemen, this is certainly a well-intentioned idea. I think that the sponsor's heart probably is, I'm sure, in the right place. The only question that we're presenting to you today is whether or not this is an assignment that is reasonable for the legislature of this state to place on the Department of Health and Human Services at this time. This begins to move the State of Maine into a realm that is under the purview of the Federal Drug Administration, the FDA. The federal government has always dealt with the review of clinical trials, the licensing of pharmaceuticals, and the decision as to whether or not products go forward. The committee did not hear a problem in this state with individuals that participate in clinical trials, that they had experienced any problems or difficulties. There is a very lengthy exhaustive process that people that participate in these trials go through for their approval in the review. No problems there, apparently. If the citizens of this state or the legislature have

some difficulties with the way this whole process works, we have an avenue before us. We can talk to our federal delegation. We can communicate with the FDA. We can talk to the justice department.

Do we want to impose on the Health and Human Services Department this new assignment on top of everything else that they are already dealing with? Remember, as was touched on in a previous debate from the previous bill before us, we have a Part 2 budget coming that involves a fairly dramatic redesign of some drug benefits. We have changes in the federal law in the Medicare Part D drug benefits that the folks in the Department of Heath and Human Services are going to be dealing with for the rest of the year in trying to develop some type of wrap-around. We've given them several assignments in the previous session that have dealt with looking into the pharmaceutical industry around advertising and promotional costs. In this session they have already come before us and asked us to postpone and delay some of the deadlines from some of the requirements that we had asked them to carry out in previous assignments dealing pharmaceutical advertising. They said, 'We are overwhelmed. We're not ready. We don't have the ability to do it all. Would you delay it? Would you give us an extension?' The Health and Human Services Committee heard that and granted that extension. To now lay on top of them this initiative and to jump into this arena seems, to me, unreasonable, unwise, and I hope you reject it and vote against the pending motion.

On further motion by same Senator, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Mayo.

Senator MAYO: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I would urge that you support the majority report, which is an Ought to Pass report. Much of what the good Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen, has stated I will not necessarily disagree with. However, there is one item that he neglected to state and that is that the Department of Health and Human Services did not speak in opposition to this bill. It said that it could handle what is being asked without an appropriation, within existing resources, both financial and personnel. There are going to be a couple of others coming to us on this subject, maybe the Health and Human Services Committee will be discussing one of these this afternoon. They come to us as the result of what has taken place around the country with clinical trials, or the lack thereof of adequate clinical trials, on a couple of drugs that we have heard about in 2005.

There are problems with the clinical trials. I think, and obviously a majority of the committee, that there are problems. I think you would not have before you this morning a majority report if the committee felt that we were placing an undue burden upon the Department of Health and Human Services or if they had so indicated. Neither of those matters is really on top of this particular issue. I would again urge you to accept the majority committee report, which is Ought to Pass. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner.

Senator TURNER: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I would simply remind you that the landscape around this chamber and across the street to the Department of Health and Human Services is littered with the promises of this department that they have failed to deliver on. I would further suggest to you that when they say they can do something within existing resources, at least the last three budgets, whether they are supplemental or biennial, have holes created in them because the department said they could deliver certain savings to us. I have seen little from this department in terms of its ability to deliver on promises. I suspect, first of all, that they can't do it within existing resources. I think the points made by the good Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen, are entirely appropriate. This agency has been in trouble for some time. I understand the desire to be able to have clinical trials that would ensure the safety of all of us. I think that is a role best left for the federal government and the FDA. While we have had a few clinical trials that have spotlighted difficulties with them in 2005, I think we all realize that there have been follow-ups with respect to those trials. I think we're best to leave these matters where they can best be handled rather than trying to push them over to the Department of Health and Human Services in the State of Maine. Thank you very much, Madame President.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Mayo.

Senator MAYO: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I think the remarks of the good Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner, are out of line and inappropriate at this time. They would have been very appropriate in the previous legislature, the 121<sup>st</sup> legislature. We are dealing with a new department with new personnel. The problems to which he referred, I agree that there are problems, but they came to this department and the current people at the top level. The current commissioner is trying, as the people working with him, to correct what has been placed there, and what they found on their plates, when they came to their positions. I would have agreed 150% with what the good Senator said had it been stated in this chamber two years ago, but today I do not think that it holds true. Thank you, ladies and gentlemen.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner.

Senator **TURNER**: Thank you, Madame President. I would disagree with the comments from the good Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Mayo. I think the comments are appropriate. If you wanted to modify this resolve to say, 'Why don't you begin paying your bills to providers in an accurate fashion?' that might be a resolve that would be useful to this chamber and to the department. Thank you very much, Madame President.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin.

Senator MARTIN: Thank you, Madame President. To the good Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner, I just want to remind him that the requirement for the computer came from the administration in Washington. They gave us \$25 million. We had to pay 10%. We're still trying to recover from that mess.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator ROSEN: Thank you, Madame President and members of the Senate. In an effort to bring it home, the policy that you are being asked to adopt in this Resolve is that the State of Maine will now inject itself in this entire arena called clinical trials for pharmaceutical testing which is used in the development of pharmaceutical drugs, products, or whatever that come out to the public. I'm not aware of any other state that has passed legislation that is going to take this step. Maine certainly has been out front in a variety of different efforts dealing with the pharmaceutical industry, most in a confrontational manner. We all know those take resources. We all know those take time. We have potholes to fill, programs to deliver upon, and the day-in day-out responsibilities of government that we have already assigned to many of these people. This initiative did not come from the department. They did not ask for it. They will step up, I'm sure, and do whatever the legislature imposes upon them. This is coming from us to them.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The pending question before the Senate is the motion by the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Mayo to Accept the Majority Ought to Pass Report. A Roll Call has been ordered. Is the Senate ready for the question?

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock.

Senator WOODCOCK: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. This bill is fairly straight forward, actually. Hall Pond is a very shallow pond, at 25 feet, located in the town of Paris. They are requesting, through this bill, that the use of ATVs, snowmobiles, and watercraft be banned from the pond. Hall Pond is the water supply for the town of Hebron. Located in Hebron, of course, is Hebron Academy. There is some concern for the future in terms of pollution, as it relates to that pond, from gasoline-powered engines. The local sportsmen's club is supportive of this bill. It does not ban fishing. It does not ban the use of electric motors to do so. The board of selectmen in the town of Paris voted unanimously to support this bill. I believe this is an issue of the local community wanting to protect its water supply and I think we should pass it. In so doing, I would ask you to vote against the motion that is before us so we might go on to accept the majority report.

Same Senator requested a Division.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bryant.

Senator **BRYANT**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. I would say that trying to find a balance for the Great Ponds in the State of Maine is a difficult issue when you talk about all the opportunities there are. I think with this pond they had a public hearing. They restricted motor vehicles, as far as cars and trucks, for winter use. I think there are other ways that the water department can try to improve the water quality. There is problem with the water quality currently. This is a preventive approach. We're trying to find a balance. I think there are other things that they can do. We've stopped trucks and cars from going onto the ice. I believe that we have to have reasonable criteria. If we go down this road, where every water department in the State of Maine wants to restrict recreational activities on their water body, which they all do, and we don't

have strict criteria on how to deal with that, I think we're making a mistake. I'd ask you to accept the ought not to pass motion.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings.

Senator HASTINGS: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. The town of Paris is in my district. The town of Hebron isn't. What really brings to bear here is that is a matter of local interest. I think this is a matter that the people in the local area know best. The protection of public water supplies should be of utmost importance to all of us here in this Senate. What have we here? We have the town of Hebron drawing this water from the town of Paris. We have the town of Paris, through its board of selectmen and the hunting and fishing club, which has the most interest in this, all supporting the protection of this particular water supply. I understand that there is also interest from the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Committee, but the overriding concern has to be the protection of the water supply. Let's pay attention. Let's listen to what those local people in Paris are saying. They know what is best for this water supply. They have conceded that Hebron should have the benefit of this for their water supply. I urge you, strongly, to vote against the pending motion and support the Ought to Pass motion once made. Thank you very much.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Savage.

Senator **SAVAGE**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. The good Senator from Oxford, Senator Bryant, said there is no problem now. I've been here 10 years now and it seems to me we're always being reactive. Why not, on this issue, be proactive?

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bryant.

Senator BRYANT: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. I think that we need to be clear. If you're going to restrict the access to the Great Ponds in the State of Maine on every issue of drinking water, and we've dealt with this a number of times within our committee, you have to have strict criteria and you have to follow the same path all the time. You can't pick one pond and restrict access and not do it to another one. A number members of the committee are okay with doing just this one or that one. You are not going to be able to do that. You are going to cause uncertainty out there for the general public and all the water districts are going to want to restrict access to the Great Ponds. That's one piece that they feel strongly about. It's our job to have a balance. I think the balance is to keep the cars and trucks off there and restrict more to intake part of that lake. I think there are other things they can do without just banning everything. That's where I feel we ought to be. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **HASTINGS** of Oxford, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.
