**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings.

Senator HASTINGS: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I'll just speak briefly on this, in opposition to the minority report. As you can see, most of the Judiciary Committee felt that this should be Ought Not to Pass. What I want to tell you here is that you are not voting whether you are for or against walking trails. This is not a vote about that at all. This bill was put in, I think, for the purpose of providing something of a roadmap to municipalities as to how to create a municipal walking trail. What we discovered in reviewing the bill was that all of the authority that was covered by this proposed already existed with municipalities. Municipalities had the power to take each and every step that was proposed for the creation of walking trails. I guess it just wasn't under a section that was titled 'Creation of Walking Trails'. We had some concern, in the committee, about creating what essentially an unnecessary law that perhaps in the future might end up with unintended conflicts between the two. The other concern we had was that the bill also included provisions to add municipal walking trails to the definition of lands where private landowners are exempt or immune from liability for allowing public use. That definition is an extremely broad definition as it exists, covering almost any private land allowed to be used for public use. We are a little bit concerned about saying it includes everything but especially includes walking trails. There is something in the first part of the bill that says everything is covered for immunity, and we add that it also adds that it also includes this, and this, and this. Are we saying somehow that the beginning of the bill really didn't cover everything? With that, I would urge the chamber to oppose the pending motion and go on to accept the Ought Not to Pass. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Gagnon.

Senator GAGNON: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. This is my bill and we did have somewhat of an issue in my city in that most of the laws that the good Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings, was talking about really are related more to more rural areas. What we are trying to do in my city, and I think in a number of cities, is to try to create some level of comfort by allowing landowners by helping to alleviate the fears that landowners have about the possibility of somebody getting hurt on their property or whatnot. We wanted to create a system where the municipality, in some official way, accepts a walking trail and then we can allow these communities to interrelate with each other a little better. Again, there are many cities similar to mine that have paper streets and the paper streets ended up eliminated, because of deadlines, and now suddenly kids are barred from crossing from neighborhood to neighborhood. People are concerned that if they let the kids to

ride their bikes or walk between the neighborhoods that they are somehow going to be liable. We wanted to sort of bring this all together in one place and have sort of an outline. I did have extensive discussions because of the original bill. I think what the good Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings, was really a previous draft. We tried to deal with the committee's concerns and worked with the Maine Municipal Association, which originally didn't care for the bill but actually helped write most of the amendment that now makes it acceptable to the minority. In fact, I have spoken directly with the good Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings, so I can only assume that he is opposed to walking trails since we did work out his concerns. I had promised him I would say he was opposed to walking trails on the floor of the Senate, so I've done that now. I hope that you will support the minority Ought to Pass report. I think that the Senator is correct in that it may not be needed, but it doesn't hurt to make sure that municipalities understand that they have this framework for how to create these trails and that we have people that are willing to participate, landowners in a more urban environment that will allow these walking trails between neighborhoods so that kids don't have to hit the busier streets and go around when there is a perfectly good trail that has been there for decades. It's just a concern that people have. Thank you.

Senator HOBBINS: Thank you, Madame President and members of this body. I can attest that the good Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings, is in favor of walking trails. He looks more fit and stealth than maybe myself and the good Senator from Kennebec, Senator Gagnon. This bill is one of many bills that have crept up in the legislature during the past few sessions relating to the issue of liability and what would happen if non-profit entities went out and put together some type of a walking network or some type of walking trail network around the state. It is really encouraging that the use of intermobile transportation money from the Department of Transportation at the federal level and money from the Department of Conservation and other state agencies have allowed municipalities and non-profit entities to put together a walking system, which I think is good. First of all, I think it's a good tourist attraction and to have individuals come to Maine because of the quality of our walking trails. We've utilized, over the past three or four years, abandoned railroad track beds, which have been very useful. In fact, there is a bill in the legislature just to clarify that people that own abandon railroad tracks where trails that have been put together are not liable by allowing for these right of ways to be used.

This amendment is a complete replacement of the original bill. As the good Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings, will tell you and I probably would concur, it was a close call as to whether

the original bill was needed in the first place. The Maine Municipal Association provided this draft after the fact, after the vote was taken, and after I, as a courtesy to the good Senator, put my name on the report. I have to tell you, after having read the amendment the Maine Municipal Association put together, it does provide a simplified optional framework for non-profit entities, municipal governments, and the public, in general, to use as a mechanism, such the City of Waterville wants, to in establishing these walking trails. If you don't pass this bill, it's not an earth shattering scenario, but I think it does give a little more guidance and a little more clarity in this area that is brand new in the past few years to state government and the liability issues that they possibly entail. Thank you.

Senator HASTINGS: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I just want to speak very briefly on this. As you can see, I supported the Ought Not to Pass. I do want to point out the difficulties we are starting to face in the Judiciary Committee under the Freedom of Information Act because of electronic information. This was a bill that, if passed, would have made e-mail addresses not public, they could not be disclosed by the towns unless permission was given. I would point out that the minority has changed that and would support that the e-mail addresses not be disclosed if the owner of the name so requested to the municipality and that it not be made part of a database. The problem that municipalities, and I think state government, are facing now all of a sudden is that there are databases of e-mail addresses which are targets for commercial uses who then take advantage of groups. They are able to obtain huge numbers of names that are then targeted, maybe by fishing licenses or auto registrations or whatever. We could not craft this narrowly enough to protect the rights of the public. It is a subject matter that we will be facing over and over. I'm afraid we, as a group. will have to find a way to deal with this because of its nontraditional nature. Thank you.
