In Senate Chamber Tuesday January 17, 2006

Senate called to order by President Beth Edmonds of Cumberland County.

Prayer by Pastor Stephen Tracey of Lakeview Orthodox Presbyterian Church in Rockport.

PASTOR TRACEY: Thank you for your kind invitation to be here today. I understand that the Governor has delayed this evening's speech due to the unexpected death of Melvin Francis. It is right that we pause at such a time. There is a time to be born and a time to die; a time to weep; a time to mourn; and a time to keep silence. This is such a time. Grief is an intensely painful thing. Sudden grief is a ferociously painful thing. C.S. Lewis, that great Narnian, once wrote 'no one ever told me it would be like this' at the beginning of his book A Grief Observed, written following the death of his wife. A year later he wrote another book entitled The Problem of Pain. Many of you know what he means. You have experienced grief and you have been into that empty place, that place of numbness, of sorrow, that place of questions. To observe grief is heartbreaking. To share grief is anguish. To be grief-stricken is to be slain by life itself.

Five years ago, on the 12th of January 2001, I was traveling with my wife and children on a flight from Ireland as we were making our way to Portland to visit a church in Rockport. While we were on that plane my wife's sister was killed in a car crash. She was on her way to school to pick up four little boys. Grief forces us to ask questions, questions we don't want to ask or think about. Questions about God. What's He doing? Does He care? Is He there? Questions about people. What will they do now? How will they cope? Questions about ourselves, which are perhaps the most uncomfortable. What if it had been me or my wife or my children or if I had been driving the truck that left someone else dead?

At times like these we turn to old familiar words. The Lord is my Shepard. I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures. He leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul. He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil for Thou art with me. Thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Turning to words is one thing. Turning to the Shepard of whom these words speak is another thing. He has been into that valley of death, our God. He has suffered and died and risen from the dead and there is a comforter for those who mourn, Jesus Christ. Let us pray.

Our God and Father, we come before You this day knowing that You are incomparable, that You do not faint or grow weary, and that Your understanding is unsearchable; but we grow faint and weary and we do not understand. This is a day of mourning and pray for the family of Melvin Francis, that in their grief and pain You will draw near to them. Help them through these raw,

cold days. Help them through the shock and the numbness, the deep searing pain. Oh God of all comfort, comfort them, we pray. Draw near to his wife, to their children, to their grandchildren, to their foster children, to their friends, and the community at Pleasant Point. We pray, too, for Scott Colcord and Daren Holmes. Scott was driving that truck. Draw near to them in their shock and in their grief.

We pray that in the midst of all our important business that You will be merciful to us. You have called us to be wise and to apply our hearts to wisdom and to seek You while You may be found. Grant us Your grace to do this, for You are full of compassion and pardon. This we pray in Jesus Christ. Amen.
