I wanted to draw members' attention to this item, as it is a major item that is before all of us, and it is 666 pages long. I am not going to comment on whether that is any kind of an omen, Madam Speaker, but I do want to draw your attention to the fact that that is a very large document and we are not going to be printing it and putting it on each of your desks. However, the documents are ready. They are ready for you to use them, to review them, to take them home with you and read them by the fire over the weekend, and you can reach all of those documents online.

There is a handout being distributed, it may be on your desks already, from the Clerk of the House with specific instructions on where you can find those documents. I encourage members, specifically of the State and Local Government Committee and the Judiciary Committee, to please take a look at them over the weekend because your hearings are Monday and Tuesday with us, followed by Criminal Justice on Wednesday and Thursday.

I would only add for reference that these are the same documents you used for the Supplemental Budget with two differences: First, they should have lengthier justification statements provided by the departments, and second, they will

have historical information from FY '08 and '09, including the revisions we just made in the Supplemental Budget.

While I have the opportunity, Madam Speaker, I would like to thank the Office of Fiscal and Program Review and the Revisor's Office for working very hard with the Office of Technology to make sure we got these documents, made available in their complete form, as soon as we possibly could. Thank you, Madam Speaker. Please, everyone, do your homework over the weekend, and with that, Madam Speaker, I move that this bill be referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, ordered printed and sent for concurrence.

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ALLOCATE FULL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL VETERINARY MEDICAL SERVICES ACT

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the President of the United States and the United States Congress as follows:

WHEREAS, the State of Maine and the United States are currently experiencing a shortage of food animal veterinarians in rural agricultural areas, in certain population groups and in certain disciplines, such as public health, regulatory veterinary medicine and diagnostic laboratory medicine; and

WHEREAS, the financial constraints of servicing debt loads averaging \$120,000 for veterinarian graduates in 2008 resulting in loan repayment obligations approaching \$1,381 per month, assuming a standard interest rate and a standard 10-year repayment term, prevent many new veterinary school graduates from choosing to work in underserved areas and disciplines; and

WHEREAS, the shortage of food animal veterinarians has critical homeland security ramifications since these individuals act as "agricultural first responders" in the early detection of foreign animal diseases, and the early detection of these diseases is of utmost importance in limiting widespread dissemination of these

potentially devastating diseases such as foot and mouth disease and avian influenza, known as "bird flu"; and

WHEREAS, a food animal veterinary needs assessment commissioned by the Maine Veterinary Medical Association in 2007 has identified many underserved geographic areas for food animal veterinary services in Maine; and

WHEREAS, the food animal veterinary needs assessment identified student loan repayment as the primary obstacle to recent graduates deciding to enter food animal veterinary practice; and

WHEREAS, an adequate supply of food animal veterinarians is a key component in the continued assurance of a safe, wholesome food supply, in the prevention of foreign animal disease incursions and in monitoring and reporting diseases of human health concern; and

WHEREAS, the National Veterinary Medical Services Act, which passed in the United States Senate by unanimous consent in November 2003 and was signed by former President George W. Bush on December 6, 2003, authorized "such sums as necessary" to provide student loan repayment to veterinary school graduates who agree to work in underserved areas, has not been fully implemented by the United States Department of Agriculture; and

WHEREAS, funding of this important Act has the potential to alleviate the food animal veterinary shortage and stimulate small business growth in the State of Maine and in the Nation; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully urge and request that all steps be taken to allocate full funding for the National Veterinary Medical Services Act as part of the 2009 economic stimulus plan; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable Barack H. Obama, President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Bremen, Representative Pieh.

Representative **PIEH**: Thank you, Madam Speaker. Madam Speaker, Men and Women of the House. You will find on page 15 of today's Calendar a very important resolution that is a unanimous report from the Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry Committee. We feel that this needs to go to the President of the United States, Congress, and our congressional delegation. I know that you all have animals, large animals, and you have a real problem getting a vet.

Some folks are really lucky in western Maine: They have a veterinarian named Dr. Cooper. Dr. Cooper comes on your farm and takes care of your animals, does it well, and we completely rely on him, those folks that use him. The only problem is that Dr. Cooper is 88. He is 88 years old, he still practices veterinary medicine and there is nobody to take his place.

One of the reasons for this, the shortage—and it is national, it is throughout the country—is that when you finish veterinary school you will have an average debt load of \$120,000. That is a daunting kind of debt for someone to take on coming out of school, so when you go to pick what practice you are going to do, it is almost a no-brainer to decide you would rather do six cats and neuter or spay them in a day than help one cow give birth. The amount of money you bring in is very, very different.

So in December 2003, Congress unanimously, and with the support of the past President, created the National Veterinary Medical Services Act, which is an act that provides funding so

that if someone is willing to serve in an underserved area such as Maine, they can get help repaying their student loans. The only problem is they never put any money in it, so it is an act sitting and waiting for funding, and our committee unanimously thought that this might be a good time to attempt, at least, to bring that to the notice of the folks who are deciding what goes in the stimulus package. We thank you very much, and we hope for your support on this resolution.
