In Senate Chamber Thursday January 14, 2010

Senate called to order by President Elizabeth H. Mitchell of Kennebec County.

Prayer by Reverend Dr. Douglas Nielsen, First Congregational Church, UCC of Saco.

REVEREND NIELSEN: Thank you, President Mitchell. Good morning to all of you and I see that you are well trained to stand up. That's all good. I'll try to keep this very brief, as brief as your agenda for the day. This is my third time being back here. I am pleased to be among you. It is a way of me standing in the place of power, to bring to the place that the power exists, and the context of the larger power that draws us all together. I stand here this morning in painful recognition of the devastation that has captured our awareness from Haiti and touches our hearts. I stand here also this morning as a minister of the United Church of Christ, as a grateful senior minister of the church in Saco, and as a thankful constituent of the Senators Hobbins and Sullivan. I stand here this morning appreciative of the work that you do, knowing that just last Tuesday the Hall of Flags was filled with people trying to tell you what to do, knowing that an hour from now the Hall of Flags will be filled with people reminding you of what they think you should do. I am not insensitive to the important role you play. I appreciate the work, the difficult work, you do. I stand here as a minister coming out of the Christian perspective and post-Christmas. I invite you to cut me a little slack as a Christian minister and share the words of the post-Christmas experience from Howard Thurman. A brief perspective and then a briefer prayer.

Howard Thurman said 'When the song of the angel is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and the princes are home, when the shepherds are back with the flock, the real work begins. To find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the state, to bring peace, to make music in the heart.'

It is in appreciation of the important and difficult work you do that I invite each of you, in the manner consistent with your own music of the heart, to join my heart in a word of prayer. Oh God, called by many names, I pray on behalf of this gathering that they may experience a few friends who understand them and remain true friends despite differences, that they may experience a sense that the work they do is real and hard and without which this state would be much poorer. I pray that they experience a mind unafraid to travel the rough tough roads, even trails not yet blazed. I pray that they experience an understanding heart, a sense of humor, and a feeling of Your presence. I pray that the act in boldness of action and have the patience to wait for the coming of all these things and the wisdom to recognize them when they come. Amen.

Thank you all for the work you do on behalf of the people of Maine.
