On motion by Senator **COURTNEY** of York, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Perry.

Senator **PERRY**: Thank you, Madame President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, this may not be a necessary explanation but this is my bill and I thought I'd just tell you very

briefly what it is. It does not change any policy in any way regarding selling beer on golf courses from mobile carts. We had some surprisingly long debates over that issue years ago and the policy has been set. What this addresses is a couple of municipal golf courses in the state of Maine that lease out their restaurant space. The law says that you need to be an employee of the municipality to man the mobile cart. These municipal golf courses lease out the restaurant, so they are not employees of the city. Every thing is the same except for allowing these two leased, that we know of, restaurants to operate without a municipal employee. That is the extent of this bill.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Davis.

Senator **DAVIS**: Thank you, Madame President. Men and women of the Senate, this bill allows municipal golf courses to serve alcohol on municipal golf courses. My objection may be probably throwing snow against the wind, but here goes. I think I will remind you that city golf courses are funded by tax dollars, local tax dollars. I base this on personal experience. I grew up on a municipal golf course. I caddied. I worked on the greens. I was a special policeman ranger for several years. I don't think alcohol on municipal golf courses is a good idea. I will close by saying that this, municipal golf courses are supported by local tax dollars. I think it is inappropriate and not necessary. Thank you, Madame President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting.

Senator **NUTTING**: Thank you, Madame President. I also will quickly rise to speak in opposition to this. I've always had a concern about drinking and driving. Somebody may be getting alcohol while they are driving their cart and have a family member or a teenager riding with them. I think it's one thing, even though I didn't support it, to have it on private golf courses, but the whole municipal thing to me is a whole other big step that I think is a step in the wrong direction. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Perry.

Senator PERRY: Thank you, Madame President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, this is bringing back memories of the hours of debate in the other Body when we set this policy in the first place. The simple matter is these golf courses made the best of it in Bangor. It was just a nuisance to deal with. What happened was that this spring and summer, the first half of it was a wash out. The people who lease this restaurant, hard working folks, had a miserable summer. The first beautiful day of good weather happened to coincide with the start of a really big tournament, the biggest golf tournament of the year in the city of Bangor. They stood to make about \$1,000 in profit through this tournament selling from their mobile cart that they had bought a license for to operate. Come to find out this other golf course had called them saying, 'How did you get licensed? We're running into trouble.' They said, 'It was easy, we just did this thing and this other thing.' As they looked into it, trying to help this other golf course, they found out that, in fact, they were not properly licensed and they needed a city employee to do this. They lost that golf tournament. They made an arrangement with the City of

Bangor to put a city employee in the cart. They handled the money. They managed through it but it just was not a good arrangement for anyone. It's simply a streamlining thing. It's not going to change the policy that we made on these municipal golf courses. I think of a municipal auditorium and civic center where the City of Bangor is in the business of running a bar at events. If you want to rent the Civic Center in Bangor, which city owns and runs, you can't job that out. You have to buy it through the City of Bangor. This is nothing new. They lease out the restaurant, where it is also a licensed Class A restaurant with a bar. This simply makes it possible for these folks at these two golf courses, that we know of, to operate without a whole lot of nonsense to comply with the law. That is simply what it is. Thank you.
