THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator ROSEN: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen, you have before you item 2-1, which is the vote out of the Appropriations and Financial Affairs Committee, unanimously supporting the Executive's choice to nominate Sawin Millett as Commissioner of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. I think it's fair to say that the unanimous vote out of the committee and the testimony that we heard in front of the Appropriations Committee on Monday reflect what all of us that have worked with the former Representative Millett know. He is an knowledgeable public servant. He is a man who has really dedicated his professional life to serving the people of the state of Maine; having served at the highest levels of the Executive Branch, under several different Governors of different party enrollment, taking on major areas of responsibility; having served as a member of the Legislature; and having served his local community. He has presented to the people of Maine his dedication, his knowledge, his skill, and probably, in my opinion, is the very best choice at this particular moment in history when we find ourselves challenged with the fiscal pressures that we all will be asked to address during this legislative session. We had appear before the committee the current Speaker from the other Body, the current Minority Leader from the other Body, the

previous Chair of the Appropriations Committee, and the previous Commissioner under our previous Executive. All, from a variety of political points of view and backgrounds, enthusiastically presented testimony in support of Sawin. He is the best choice at this particular time. He is a man that will serve us all well. His credibility is just what we need and I encourage an enthusiastic vote in support of his confirmation. Thank you Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond.

Senator DIAMOND: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise to second everything that the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen, has shared with you this morning and might add a couple more items of my own. I've known Sawin Millett for many years but I never really got to really know him until the last two years when he and I worked on the Appropriations Committee together. During that time, Mr. President, you and others in leadership worked with the Chairs and the Leads. Representative Millett, of course, was one of those Leads in our committee and we did pass five unanimous budgets in two years for many reasons, the least of which was Sawin Millett's leadership. It was an honor to work with him. It was a pleasure to work with him. I will be voting for his confirmation today with a great deal of enthusiasm. Thank you Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven.

Senator CRAVEN: Thank you Mr. President. I also wanted to add my support and congratulations to Commissioner Millett. I found him, as I worked with him for six years, brilliant as well as trustworthy and very generous with his information and with his sharing of the vast information that he certainly has. As well, as somebody who is in charge of the State's coffers, we need somebody who is trustworthy and that we can trust when he gives us the bottom line. I will be supporting this nomination. Thank you Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Senator KATZ: Thank you Mr. President. I sat through the Appropriations Committee confirmation hearing and made three observations that I think everybody who knows Sawin Millett would agree with. He's an extraordinary person. He is the epitome of public service and we're very lucky to have him. Just as you saw today, there were people from both sides of the aisle, including the distinguished Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond, who came. Everyone had the same message about his competence, about his dedication, and about his great respect and trust that the he has, that he has earned, over decades of service to the state of Maine. I, too, would encourage everyone to support this nomination and accept the recommendation of the committee. Thank you.

Had I not campaigned as hard as I did, as vigorously as I did, he would not be in the position to accept this esteemed position. With that being said, I would like to echo the sentiments of everyone and say that I hope that it is a unanimous vote. Thank you.
