### JOINT RESOLUTION IN HONOR OF ST. PATRICK'S DAY AND IN RECOGNITION OF THE IRISH CONTRIBUTION TO MAINE AND TO THE UNITED STATES

WHEREAS, St. Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland, known for bringing Christianity to Ireland and, it is said, for instilling a sense of literacy and learning that allowed Ireland to become the "isle of saints and scholars" when the rest of Europe was in the Dark Ages; and

WHEREAS, the feast day of St. Patrick is the only national holiday that is given recognition outside its native land, which indicates the Irish influence throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, the modern secular holiday of St. Patrick's Day was first celebrated in America in Boston during colonial days and the first St. Patrick's Day Parade in New York City was in 1766 and now all Americans celebrate St. Patrick's Day with pride; and

WHEREAS, millions of Irish people emigrated from Ireland in the 1800s to escape brutal poverty and starvation during the Irish potato famine, and most of those people came to America to start new lives and to embrace and contribute to a new land; and

WHEREAS, tens of thousands of Irish immigrants arrived in New England and many came to Maine, and the Irish have been an important part of Maine's culture, history and society ever since; and

WHEREAS, within a few years of their arrival in the United States and in Maine, these Irish immigrants became part of the American cultural landscape while preserving the best of their native culture, and they dedicated themselves to helping build this Nation and State; and

WHEREAS, 4 signers of the Declaration of Independence were Irish-born and 9 signers were of Irish ancestry and 19 Presidents of the United States have proudly claimed Irish heritage, including George Washington, the father of our country; John Fitzgerald Kennedy; and Ronald Reagan; and

WHEREAS, the 44,000,000 Americans of Irish ancestry, like their forebears, continue to enrich all aspects of life in the United States, in science, education, art, agriculture, business, industry, literature, music, athletics, entertainment and military and government service; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-fifth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to encourage the celebration of St. Patrick's Day, and, recognizing the valuable contribution to our State and to our Nation of all Irish-American citizens, we urge the citizens of the State to commend and celebrate the integrity and richness of the Irish culture.

#### READ.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hobbins.

Senator HOBBINS: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, this week has been a very important week. First of all we celebrated the Franco-American tradition and culture yesterday. I'm proud to say that my father was half French and half Irish, and I am a quarter Franco-American. Today we are celebrating St. Patrick's Day. I thank the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven, for her eloquence in saying the Our Father in Irish and, as always, the poem is very touching. Also I'd like to have everyone think about their own historical backgrounds and I'm sure all of you have great pride and memories of your backgrounds also.

I do want to share with you a story that you will, I think, appreciate. In 2008 we had a monumental election. I'm not talking about the Presidential election. I'm talking about an election for the State Senate in Lewiston, Maine. On that date the citizens of Lewiston elected the first Irish born State Senator in the whole country, of any State Senate in the whole country, in fact any legislator in the whole country, when the good gentle lady from Androscoggin, Senator Craven, was elected. As I do every year, with 17 different trips, I went to Ireland with a cast of very honorable Maine citizens. Some people might call them great Americans, but I will say that they are a cast of good citizens. We do that after every election. We go to Ireland. Go back and find our roots. This time, which was a real special occasion, I was treated a little differently over in Ireland because of the good Senator from Androscoggin. When I arrived I didn't realize that a national Irish television camera crew and national press had followed the Senator from Androscoggin around the last week of the election. They followed her on the plane and over to Ireland. Of course we had made arrangements through a former member of the other Body, former Representative Ed Kelleher, who was the tour guide for most of us during these visits, to have Senator Craven meet with us in Spiddal. We were a group of 12 Mainers who were making another pilgrimage to Ireland. When Senator Craven came little did we know that we had a rock star in our midst. There were camera crews. There were newspaper reporters. Of course everyone was very impressed. The person who was coordinating after the interviews with Senator Craven decided that they were going to have a group photo, or so we thought. Everyone lined up for the photo and they said, "No, no, no. We just want the two Senators for the photograph." Senator Craven and myself were in the photograph. I didn't realize that some of the members of the national posses thought that both Senator Craven and myself were United States Senators. After brushing aside questions about the weather in Washington D.C. and whether or not I was on the seniority of committee assignments in Washington D.C. and the United

States capital, the two of us, with a gasp from our friends, had our pictures taken. It went further than that. That picture went in every newspaper in all of Ireland. As a result of this filming there was a documentary that was in the same timeframe as 60 Minutes is, or 20-20 on the nightly news, of Senator Craven. As a result of that monumental effort I figured I should make a journey also to her hometown, to her birth home, in Connamara, which was an incredible experience. I wish I could have shared that moment because my father, who passed away 20 years ago a week after St. Patrick's Day, reminded me that many in Ireland have different Irish prayers and Senator Craven knows them all. I just didn't want it to end because I think this is a very important and special day but it also, I think, talks a little about our comradery and friendship here in the Senate. This is one of the Irish prayers. There are many but this is how this one goes. It was my father's favorite. There are woodchips, there are good ships, ships that sail the sea, but the best ships are friendships, may they always be. Thank you and happy St. Patrick's Day.

Senator **CRAVEN**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I just wanted to say that we did acknowledge that we were not U.S. Senators but after a pause the response was, "Oh well, everything is ready. We're going to have the party anyway."
