THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven.

Senator CRAVEN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, this is a tiny bill that doesn't cost anything. I was asked by three different constituents for some help in this regard. What this bill would do is to ask employers to identify or to let employees know that their earned personal time off does not have any financial value when they leave their post. I've had several people that had worked for a large out-of-state company that does business in Maine, and after working there for 24 years and having accumulated a lot of personal time, was told that they weren't going to get paid for their personal time. I think that this is fine because it's a very good benefit for people to have but I think that people should know that their accumulated or accrued time was not going to be paid for when they left the agency or left the company. This really impacts a lot of people, almost every employee in the state of Maine. The disappointment and sense of betrayal that they feel after having been an excellent employee all those years, and being proud of their perfect attendance and probably having seen their co-workers take many days off with pay, it makes them feel a little bit betrayed because they didn't know that they weren't going to get paid for this at their retirement. I would really, really like for this to go forward and for employers to be required to tell employees the value of their benefits. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Rector.

Senator RECTOR: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, this is, indeed, on the face of it, a simple request but it's complicated. It's complicated because the failure on the part of any employer, whether intentional or not, to not provide this information provides another opportunity for us to fine that employer for a failure to meet an additional State requirement that we've put on them. I think personal leave is a wonderful thing. It's one of the benefits that some businesses are able to provide and we certainly encourage those businesses that do to let their employees know about that benefit and all the other benefits that they are provided through their employment agreements. We don't think that putting in statute another requirement moves us at all along that continuum to a business environment that is friendlier, allows businesses to succeed more successfully, and allows our work environment to be more favorable and generally not over-burdensome as we have been characterized by so many around the country. I would ask that you follow the lead of the committee in this almost unanimous report and accept the Majority Ought Not to Pass Report. Let me also say that the committee did send a letter to the Department of Labor asking them to highlight on their website what they already have there, which is information that suggests that employers provide a complete information packet to their employees related to all the benefits that they receive as employees, including personal leave time if that is one of the benefits that they are fortunate to have. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Bartlett.

Senator BARTLETT: Thank you Mr. President. I found this particular bill intriguing and looked it up, the amendment that is proposed. What was striking about it is how simple it is and how flexible it is for employers. An employer can provide notice in four different ways; one is they can include the policy in an employee handbook so all the employers that already had handbooks have this covered. Two, they can post it a conspicuous common area. Three, they can post it on the company website if they have one. Four, simply provide it by request. This means that an employer need not provide anything in writing to employees unless they come forward and ask for it. That seems extraordinarily simple. It is not at all onerous. Even if an employer did not have one, once they are asked they could simply write down the policy and provide it to someone. This seems like just a simple way to facilitate communication between employees and employers, avoid miscommunication that can lead to problems upon termination, and make it crystal clear to everyone involved. Thank you, Mr. President.
