WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Maine requires the Senate to vote on certain nominations by the Governor to state departments, boards, and commissions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PAUL R. LEPAGE, Governor of the State of Maine, by the Virtue of the power vested in me as Governor under to Article V, Part 1, Section 13 of the Constitution of the State of Maine, convene the Legislature of this State, hereby requesting the Representatives and the Senators to assemble at ten o'clock in the morning in their respective chambers at the Capitol in Augusta on Tuesday, September 27th, 2011, in order to receive communications, enact a Congressional reapportionment plan, and act upon pending nominations.

The Honorable Richard H. Pierce, a former member of the Legislature and longtime educator. Mr. Pierce spent his professional life dedicated to promoting higher educational opportunities for Maine citizens as well as spending a number of years in public service. He represented the City of Waterville in the Maine House of Representatives from 1975 to 1976 and the Maine Senate from 1977 to 1982, and he ran for Governor in 1982. Mr. Pierce was also involved in many local and statewide charitable organizations and regional education organizations and was appointed by three United States Presidents to national education organizations. A graduate of the University of Maine with an MS. Ed. degree, Mr. Pierce taught public school in Oakland and was a dean at Thomas College in Waterville. In 1983, Mr. Pierce worked to help create the Maine Educational Loan Marketing Corporation (MELMAC), eventually bringing over one billion dollars to Maine on behalf of higher education. Senator **DIAMOND**: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, Dick Pierce was all of what you've just heard and more. WHEREAS, the Honorable Dan A. Gwadosky, of Augusta, passed away on August 10, 2011 at the age of 57, with his loving family at his side, after living a vital and energetic life of commitment to other people and to the State of Maine; and

WHEREAS, Dan A. Gwadosky had a long and successful political career with the State of Maine extending 33 years, exemplifying the spirit of public service and proving that honor,

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwadosky was first elected to the Maine House of Representatives in 1978 at the age of 23, representing the Town of Fairfield, and served 18 years in the House with distinction, elected Assistant Majority Leader in 1986, House Majority Leader in 1988 and Chair of the Legislative Council in 1992 and sworn in as the 92nd Speaker of the Maine House of Representatives in 1994; and

WHEREAS, as the Speaker of the House, Mr. Gwadosky's goals were to reform the legislative institution and build a new sense of civility, cooperation and common purpose in the House of Representatives, which he did during a difficult transitional period; and

WHEREAS, in 1997, Mr. Gwadosky was elected Maine's 46th Secretary of State, serving for 8 years and helping to bring his office into the digital age and serving as President of the National Association of Secretaries of State from 2002 to 2003; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwadosky served 6 years as Director of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and Lottery Operations, and also served as chair of the National Alcoholic Beverage Control Association; and

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Alfond.

Senator **ALFOND**: Thank you Mr. President. I'd like to pose a question through the Chair.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose his question.

Senator **ALFOND**: Thank you Mr. President. Could someone please describe to me the difference between furnishing and dealing, which I believe is germane to this bill.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Cumberland, Senator Alfond poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Gerzofsky.

Senator GERZOFSKY: Thank you Mr. President. I am hesitant to draw another picture after last year, but I have to to make it simple on the lay-person, because we deal with this question quite a bit and this bill really brought this question forward in committee. Two 20 year old young people are out on a Saturday night. Say it's a young couple. The boyfriend just acquired something called bath salts. They really aren't familiar with what it might be. The young man says to his girlfriend, or his buddy or whoever, "I just got this. Do you want to try some?" That's furnishing. Dealing is when you are selling something. You are going out on the open market and you are trying to sell a product, a drug. In committee, we've had a hard time grappling with that part of this bill because we're making a felony out of furnishing. Last year we worked on it and we came up with a little different scenario. Just to make a brief picture, that's pretty much what it is. A couple of people out, I believe. I believe the attorneys in this room will probably agree with me that furnishing isn't actually dealing. It's just giving something to somebody. It's furnishing them with a product. Dealing is actually selling something, especially for a profit. That's a felony now. It was a felony 10 years ago. It will be a felony forever. We catch people dealing in the state of Maine, as I've said before, they are dealers and we don't want them on our streets. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator **SCHNEIDER**: Thank you Mr. President. I request to pose a question through the Chair?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose her question.

Senator SCHNEIDER: Thank you Mr. President. The fiscal note that is on here, what does this include? I see it says total cost of convictions, but it's not clear to me about the incarceration piece of this on an annual basis. What does it cost to incarcerate somebody for a year?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Gerzofsky.

Senator **GERZOFSKY**: Thank you Mr. President. Not that I'm a know-it-all in Criminal Justice, but I believe it pegged that price at \$42,000 a year for incarceration in one of our institutions.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven.

Senator **CRAVEN**: Thank you Mr. President. I also have a question because I haven't seen the bill, but I understand that substance abuse treatment is going to be part of the treatment

and wondered if there was a matching appropriation for the substance abuse piece? Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Mason.

Senator **MASON**: Thank you Mr. President. In committee we talked about this being a three pronged approach. That's where we want to get to with this bill. Treatment is definitely something that we want to address, but I don't believe there are any matching funds. I hope I answered the question.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Sullivan.

Senator **SULLIVAN**: Thank you Mr. President. May I pose a question through the Chair?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose her question.

Senator **SULLIVAN**: Thank you Mr. President. I fully support the concept of this bill. Are we putting trafficking to make a profit and furnishing to young kids, 20 years old, at the same level? I realize the damage can be equally as much, but it seems to me two young kids go out and they have a felony on their records for the rest of their lives, maybe not even knowing what they are doing, per say. Could somebody, philosophically, help me with that? I'm not against this, I just question how we can put both at the same scale and have it equal.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from York, Senator Sullivan poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Senator KATZ: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I don't know if I have a specific answer. This is a tough bill because we're dealing with a new problem that none of know very much about. It's not a perfect bill. I wasn't involved in the drafting of it in the committee yesterday. It's not a perfect bill. I would have written it differently, but I find it significant that it came out of this committee with unanimous bi-partisan support. Actually the Maine criminal defense lawyers, which are usually the first group to come and complain if there is some gross miscalculation of class and penalty here, as I understand it and I stand corrected, basically were in favor of this bill as presented. I find that of significance. I hope that is somewhat helpful in answering the question.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator SCHNEIDER: Thank you Mr. President. Just on that last point, I'd like to remind everybody that we, as a Legislature, passed a bill, unanimously, from what was the Business, Research and Economic Development Committee, a very good bill to protect children. It happened to be my bill. It flew through the Legislature with all good intentions. It turned out that it had some serious Constitutional problems. I just remind you of that because sometimes when we work quickly, too quickly, we make mistakes. I have deep concerns about this particular piece of legislation, for a whole host of reasons; one of which is that I see that we are elevating this particular problem above all the other problems in the state. The question that has been going through my mind is; is this more important than everything else? All of a sudden there is a pool of money that springs from the heavens to fund this. I have real issues with that. I have a question that I'd like to pose through the Chair

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose her question.

Senator **SCHNEIDER**: Thank you Mr. President. Have we been defunding programs to address substance abuse and are we going to continue lessening the funding for substance abuse programs? Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Trahan.

Senator TRAHAN: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I stand here to plead with you to pass this piece of legislation because of the devastation that will be created if we do not. You can find a fault with every single piece of legislation that comes before us, but the problem that's in front of us today could be an epidemic and it could sweep across this state and affect young people and their families to the point of devastation. There are certain drugs, when unleashed on our society, that can have such an impact as to cost us far more than a fiscal note would on this bill. What is the loss that we would have of loved ones and their families and the treatment, if left unchecked? From my experience living in an area where this has taken a significant hold, I can tell you that it is a serious issue. It is a freight train that is about to go crashing through our young people. I plead with you to pass this. If there are faults with this bill, let's come back and fix them. We're getting in front of an epidemic and I plead with this Senate to please pass this bill. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Sullivan.

Senator SULLIVAN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I treat, I think, the understanding of children through an experience of 28 years at the middle school level. when this becomes a real problem. I also know that if we enact this law and we take a child and create a felony on them, we have lost that child because they cannot go on to college, they cannot get financial aid. There are so many things that I'm concerned about. Having said that, I'm equally concerned on the other side. I know that these are really messing up people. Lewiston has had a problem just this past week with it, but to rush it through for the sake that we're rushing it through. What are we doing otherwise? I still have not gotten a real response. All of a sudden, you know. Do the crime, serve the time. All of these different things. We have taken two levels. People who knowingly want to use our children as pawns and sell drugs to them and two kids, similar to what the good Senator talked about when using his 20 year old example, which was much better than a Speedo, I might add, and putting them on the very same level. That is not good public policy. Can we make a rule until we come

back in January and push it through? Can we do a temporary thing? Can we immediately authorize this Legislature to do something now through January? In January we could, again, look at this and come up and take care of these problems. I am not saying, "Let's not do anything." To do this and put it into law this quickly, how much damage are we doing to families and children, especially those who make a dumb mistake? Alcohol does a lot more damage to our young children, not only with their brain development but also in drunken driving. We need to do something and I suggest that whatever we do it be until January. We could come back with a report. We could have all cases involving held over. There has got to be a way around this, people. Just to put a law through for the sake of a law. We haven't had a chance to vet this either as an entire group. That's the difficult part here. Many of us are looking at it for the first time. I don't know what the answer is, but I don't think this, in its entirety, is the answer. I would much rather pass something with January as a sunset date and have something there. I am concerned and I don't like saying one crime is the same as the other. It is not.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman.

Senator PLOWMAN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, in response to a comment from the good Senator from York. What are we doing? The communities in Bangor have held one forum that 500 people attended to learn about bath salts. They are holding several more throughout Penobscot County. We have been asked by the people of the state of Maine, whether they are emergency room doctors or police officers or District Attorneys, to look at this now, not in January. The difference between a 20 year old handing somebody bath salts and someone selling bath salts is a matter of a couple of dollars. Bath salts is so cheap that it's easier to share than sell. You don't have to keep track of the paperwork. What's happening right now, it doesn't matter how the person acquires the drug, the drug is the most dangerous drug, behavior-wise, that can be on the streets right now. The person reacting to the drug has a huge physical change within their brain where they have no inhibitions regarding their behavior. They are extremely violent. They have no idea of what's right or wrong or what's beyond the pale. The DHS poster that I'm handing out to my employees in my area says if you see someone that is acting this way, do not try to intervene, do not approach them, do not try to engage them, and certainly don't try to restrain them. They are dangerous to themselves and others. In the Penobscot County Jail right now the greatest expansion of people there have been young, child bearing women who are doing bath salts. There are between 50 and 60 women at any given time. That's the women. People are dying from this. If they are not dying, they are showing up in our emergency rooms, where the treatment is IV Ativan that takes days and sometimes a week to bring a person back down and their heart rate back to normal. These drugs are mixed with heroin and cocaine. They are stretching our welfare dollars because these are mostly MaineCare patients. They are stretching our jail dollars because we've got people in the jails. We also have to have someone with them all the time, armed officers. When a person is in that bed, they have to be restrained and watched at all times by not only security but medical personnel. If it hasn't hit your town, thank God. It has hit the Bangor area. It's being delivered, home to home, block by block,

by people who have nothing more to do than drop off little baggies and collect \$5 bills. You can't combat that without a huge effort. The police are absolutely beside themselves because right, when they find someone with it, they say, "Give me that. Here's your ticket. Come pay your fine." Wow, what a message. You don't know if you're going to be the one that has a bad reaction. There are flashbacks. They don't know what it does long term to your brain, if you are using it. They don't know what it does long term to the women's children, whether in uteri. I know one woman who was nursing her infant child while using bath salts. She confesses to not knowing what happened for three days. Yet she had two children under the age of two to care for. Luckily, she didn't hurt anybody. This is an epidemic in certain parts of the state. How we deal with this should not come down to whether it's happening there, in your town, or not. The difference between furnishing and trafficking today is a matter of a few bucks. The message should go out that this is one of the most dangerous things to hit the streets and it's not getting the publicity. As one gentleman said the other day, if the people who have lost children to this drug would put it in their obituary rather than saying that they died unexpectedly it might hit home to everybody that thinks this is just another thing at a party. It's not just another thing at a party. It changes people and it makes them do things that no one would ever think of doing. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Senator **KATZ**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, as we consider final passage of this bill, my thoughts went back to about a year ago. It was late September. It was probably an equally beautiful day. Instead of here, I was out knocking on doors, trying to earn the privilege of being here. As I'm sure all of you did as you talked with your constituents, I learned that there are ideologically pure people out there. Some are Republicans, some are Democrats, some characterize themselves as being on the Left, others on the Right, but for the vast, vast majority of people that I've talked with, of both parties as well as unenrolled, they don't care a whole lot about partisan politics. It's that kind of inside baseball stuff that is a regular part of our lives. It really doesn't matter to most people. They sent us here to solve our state's problems, not to give up our principles as Republicans and Democrats, but to work together to make good public policy. How many times did all of hear, "Don't be like those guys in Congress, for God sake. Act like grownups." Today, as we did with the budget just a few short months ago, we are acting like grownups. I want to say thank you to Senators Plowman. Whittemore, Goodall, and Bartlett and their counterparts in the other Body. I'd also like to thank the leadership of both parties in this Body as well as the other Body for leading us to the consensus on this most partisan of issues. There is a solution. It was one of those that was proposed weeks ago, but, as in the nature of the process, we are finally getting to it today. Some may feel this is a far less than perfect solution, but this is a good consensus result and this is a good day, Mr. President, for this institution. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Bartlett.

Senator BARTLETT: Thank you Mr. President. We have come a long way from when we first started our work in the commission. I want to thank all those who served on it, particularly the Democratic leader throughout that process, Senator Seth Goodall, who did an extraordinary job, I think, of articulating core Democratic priorities going into that process and throughout the process and never giving up hope to try to get to a compromise solution. When we went into that first meeting, there was no question that the Republican map and the Democratic map were wildly different, almost worlds apart. It was hard to believe they were dealing with the same state. I had hope from that first meeting because the Republicans emphasized a principle goal of wanting to have a population deviation of one, making sure that the districts were within one person. That was something they emphasized over and over again at that first meeting and since. The Democrats emphasized their desire to keep it simple, wanting to keep the division in Kennebec County where there has been a division, minimizing the disruption to Maine voters, and respecting the historic boundaries as established by the Maine Supreme Court. After talking with some of the Republican members that said, "Look, there are at least 350 options to choose from that will get us to a population deviation of one," I had hope that we might get there, that we might be able to get to meet the Republican demand of having that population deviation of one, and the Democratic priorities of focusing on Kennebec County. It wasn't easy. There was a lot of give and take. During the commission process we didn't get there. We didn't get to a map that everyone could agree on. I am pleased to say that we are today voting on a map that does hit every one of those key goals. We have our deviation of just one and we made sure that we are respecting the historical boundaries as laid out by the Maine Supreme Court. That has been, I think, something I care a lot about because I knew that Maine voters didn't want to see dramatic change. I'm pleased that we were able to get that. I appreciate the efforts of my Republican colleagues, as well as my Democratic colleagues, for working right up until last night to get a compromise reached. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Rector.

Senator RECTOR: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, those who know me know that I am a prayerful person. Today I feel like I've experienced an answered prayer. The redistricting process that was undertaken over the Summer was no easy task. This particular activity is as partisan as anything this Body is responsible for. That's the very nature of the discussion. I want to thank all those who worked so hard together, gave up their Summer and their usual Summer activities, to help us reach what needed to be accomplished as ordered by the courts. I know they were diligent in their efforts and the sacrifices of their time were significant. The agreement appeared elusive, but I am proud and pleased to say that a final agreement has been reached. As the Senator for most of Knox County, which was at the front lines of the proposed changes, I had constituents of all political stripes ready to weigh in on this issue. Change is never easy, yet opinions are abundant, as you all know. I probably heard as many plans as those that were considered by both sides of the aisle. What was clear to me is that we would be best served if a plan could be agreed upon so that we could pass it with a two-thirds vote, recognizing that neither side would achieve all their goals, but gaining, as an institution, by our long tradition of respectful consensus. I thank the leaders, especially President Raye and Senators Plowman and Whittemore, along with Senators Goodall and Bartlett, and our Democratic colleagues, for sticking with the process so that agreement could be reached. As my colleague Senator Katz just said, I think this institution and the people of the state of Maine are well served by that accomplishment. For me personally, I feel like I have again experienced the grace of an answered prayer.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Courtney.

Senator COURTNEY: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I also want to rise today and thank the commission. The work that you all did was really extraordinary. Senator Whittemore, Senator Bartlett, and Leads, Senator Goodall and Senator Plowman. I think especially the Leads, Senator Goodall and Senator Plowman, really showed some extraordinary leadership in being willing to fight like heck and still maintain a real cordial relationship. I believe that is ultimately what got us to this today. Yesterday I was walking around through the halls and I saw my good friend from Cumberland, Senator Diamond, on the balcony out there. It's a good place to go out and think and get a little fresh air, as most of you know. He was kind of joking and said, "You know, we could probably figure this out between the two of us." You know what? I'm glad we did because the people of Maine expect us to govern. They don't expect us to defer things to the court. They expect us to do what they sent us here for. If we can maintain that attitude and maintain those relationships, even when we get mad and frustrated at one another, we really can do some pretty extraordinary things. With that, I want to thank the commission and I want to thank the Leadership, the President and the Minority Leader and the Assistant Minority Leader. I think if not for their work at pulling this all together. We would not be in this place had it not been for the contributions of the commission. It really is

truly an extraordinary opportunity to be part of. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven.

Senator **CRAVEN**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I just want to rise to say how relieved I am that we have a bill that I can support and vote for because as everybody, well a lot of people, know that Androscoggin County was a big pawn in this discussion. As much as I love our neighbors to the south, I don't want to be competing with them for business or for attention or for a representative. I am grateful to the commission for having worked so hard and for having kept Androscoggin County in the Second District. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Goodall.

Senator GOODALL: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I rise today to also thank all members that participated in working towards a consensus today. Like many legislative efforts, sometimes they move faster towards the end of the game then they do in the beginning and in the middle. In addition to that, I think it's also important for us to recognize the hard work of the staff and the volunteers, as well as people participating in each party who were passionate about these issues. It was over the course of many long, hot Summer days and a lot of weekends that we put a lot of effort in in order to arrive at the plan upon which we are hopefully enacting unanimously here in a matter of minutes and will become law. Thank you to my good friends and colleagues on the Republican side, Senator Plowman and Senator Whittemore, leadership and Senator Bartlett for your efforts and hopefully we can have a successful process that has unanimous results in the upcoming 2013 Legislative redistricting.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Snowe-Mello.

Senator SNOWE-MELLO: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I also rise to thank the commission, but really to thank our good President and Leadership, especially the Republican leadership who really, as always, extended a hand of compromise. I think that is one thing about this Senate this year, this term, that I have seen that is a breath of fresh air and a true change for the better. When I first saw this plan my reaction was, "Oh no, we're going to be with Portland." All due respect to my Portland friends, but as my good Senator from Lewiston, Senator Craven, all I thought was, "Lewiston/Auburn, we're not going to stand a chance because we're going to be connected to the populated town of Portland and we're going to lose any identify that we have." I was willing to go along with the original plan, but I truly am very appreciative that this compromise came down and was offered because I think it's the right way to go. Thank you very much.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Sullivan.

Senator **SULLIVAN**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, may I suggest to the pundits and to the newspaper

reporters that they send a record to what this Senate has done today. We passed 82, 87, or 92 bills, or whatever the number was, this morning unanimously in record time, Mr. President. We have passed redistricting with a compromise that I am willing to bet no one in this Chamber is 100% happy with, which tells us it's a good bill. We did it maintaining friendships. My Senate Chair from State and Local Government, we get along famously well and have a lot of good laughs. We've done it the right way. We've shown how Republicans and Democrats can come together, each bringing to the table their principles, but also the spirit of compromise, for the Maine people. I'm especially proud to be here today. Thank you, Mr. President, for your leadership and getting along. This has worked well. Let's send those newspapers to Washington D.C. and show them how Maine people solve problems the right way. Thank you.

Off Record Remarks

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman

Senator PLOWMAN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I have to say this was one of the longest Summers and I didn't get to do as much with my family as I had wanted to, which gave me a great amount of frustration as we did not reach an agreement within the commission. That is the sole regret that I have, that we worked that long and did not come to a consensus before. As the Republican side came forward with their plan, we met way in advance of the first meeting in order to determine what we had to do to make sure we met every letter of the law, whether it was the Constitution, the statutes, or the case law. We looked at why we were there, which was the lawsuit, the federal lawsuit that said we had to create the equal districts. One man, one vote. The equal protection clause in the United States Constitution. We looked at the federal case law that said that everything had to be continuous compact. We looked at what we didn't have to do, which was to protect incumbent seats. We did not have to worry about were addresses were. You heard there were 350 ways to come up with a deviation of one, but not all of them were continuous compact or would meet the letter of the law. There were many. We had to look at not crossing geopolitical lines, meaning you didn't go into towns and you didn't break up a lot of counties. We came up with a number of plans. Those plans, by the way, were produced by one of the smartest men I know, who has been involved in redistricting for three decades. If you ever want to draw a map, use Dave Emery. We sent Dave Emery home many, many nights asking for ways that we thought that we could come to an agreement. He spent many, many nights working on those at home and bringing them back to us for the next meeting. We took this duty very seriously and we believed that there was give and take in the negotiating process. As we went forward, we put forth our plan and we believed that it was Constitutional and met all of the case law that was put forth, including the ones that were brought forth by the Maine Judicial Supreme Court. One of the biggest things that they brought up was that they think that we should never add to the travel demands of a Congressman. We factored that into our first map as well. As we went along, we developed several other

proposals, all of which did exactly what we wanted to do from the very beginning. They met every letter of the law; Constitutional, statutory, and case law, including the one that is in front of you. The one that is in front of you was, in our mind, a very viable option and has proven in the end to be the viable option. I thank the Legislative leadership for coming together and bringing us to a point today where we are having the most civil discussion that could have come out of the last eight or nine weeks. We have arrived where we needed to be. Not all of you had to take the same journey that the fourteen of us on the commission did. For that, any time you want to hear the stories I'd be glad to regale you in detail, but it's not that fun. I have learned that Seth can take as well as give when it comes to debating in private. He has done a great job maintaining the civility that we started with. We didn't always agree. We backed up a bunch of times. We started over and we'll do that again in January on different issues. Always the idea was, as the Republicans put forth their plan, to meet the letter of the law and to make sure that when we did take a plan to the court that it would be sound proof and Constitutional and that when we bring this before the court we will not have someone in the position and with the ability to contest what we've arrived at. This will be the plan. It's sound. It's constitutional. We're very proud to have said that. Thank you, Mr. President. I appreciate your attention.

Off Record Remarks

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Patrick.

Senator PATRICK: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I would like to echo the sentiments of the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven, for I live in Oxford County and the people of Oxford County are thankful for the ultimate outcome that we bring forward here now. This is probably not the time to have a brillcream moment, so I'm going to try to be as tactful as I can. Although we talk of bi-partisanship, the other part of the bi-partisanship that I want to bring up and thank people for is for the people getting involved in the process and the editorial boards getting involved in the process because I think they also added to bringing the bi-partisanship and getting this ultimate agreement that we came to. It is in light of having not only the Senate members and the committee working together, but having the people have their say because there were times when I think we all knew where things were headed and stuff. It all came out for the better and I know those in Oxford County can be rest assured that this is a good plan and I will be supporting it. Thank you, Mr. President.

Senator **SNOWE-MELLO** of Androscoggin requested and received leave of the Senate that members and staff be allowed to remove their jackets for the remainder of this Session.

This being an Emergency Measure and having received the affirmative vote of 35 Members of the Senate, with no Senators having voted in the negative, and 35 being more than two-thirds of the entire elected Membership of the Senate, was **PASSED TO BE ENACTED** and having been signed by the President, was presented by the Secretary to the Governor for his approval.

On motion by Senator **COURTNEY** of York, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hobbins.

Senator **HOBBINS**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I'd like to thank all the members of this Body for their deliberations and patience regarding this very, very important subject matter. In a very short period of time in Maine, this drug we're talking about has taken hold in many towns and cities across the state. It was very important for this Body and the other Body to act immediately on this issue that has raised such concerns to our communities and among our colleagues, on both sides of the aisle and even in our independent zone in the front row. To both the Democratic and the Republican caucuses, I appreciate the support that was given in an earlier vote for the Senate Amendment from the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Mason. Even though this Body and the other Body did not reach consensus on this amendment, we have had very meaningful discussions this evening and this afternoon in our debate, much of which I believe will be the starting point for a continued discussion when this Body returns in January. I am pleased that so many legislators from both parties have made a commitment that this issue will receive priority attention during the next legislative session. We must address the larger issues, though, of sentencing, alternative sentencing programs, and rehabilitation for drug addiction. Those are the other underlying issues that surround this particular issue that we are debating and voting on tonight. It is our job, as legislators, to respond to the concerns of our community and I believe the decisions we have made today, and we will make, will act as a stopgap until the next session to address these ongoing issues. We must remember that there are larger issues that we need to deal with with respect to sentencing for drug offenses and the issues of addressing the addiction issues that confront us in an epidemic manner here in Maine. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Sullivan.

Senator SULLIVAN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I am not going to even try to block this. Some of you may care or not care. I understand the importance of this problem, but if we don't pass this with an Emergency Enactor on it, it means it passes with a majority vote which means it goes until the end of December anyways. For the importance of this, and I agree with the importance of it, I'm going to support this with the understanding that it is has been made clear to me that both sides of the aisle and leadership has agreed we will be able to come back and visit this. We need to do something now. I still have a real problem when we have two very different crimes being given as felonies. I'm afraid we will ruin some futures there. Having said that, the bigger issue is that we need to act and we need to act now. To strip this off, we might have been able to do it and we might not have been able to do it. What does it prove except that that message that we started out at the beginning of today with, to go to Washington and show them how we do it in Maine. If we're going to do another one, do something with the understanding that we have commitment from both sides and that we will come back and tweak what we need to tweak and do this correctly for the people of Maine and for our young people. I will place a vote here showing both faith in the system and faith in the honesty of both parties as we sit here. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Craven.

Senator **CRAVEN**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I will be voting for this final Enactment, however I have great concerns about the cost of this bill. We just came from the Appropriations room, where they exempted it from the table, but they had no money to back it up. Now they have to go looking for the money. This bill was presented, or represented, by the same Administration that tried to gut our services for treatment for addictions last budget cycle. While I'm very relieved that this didn't happen, I'm sure it's going to happen again because we are now looking for over \$100 million worth of costs that we have no funds to cover. That is my concern and I just wanted to say that for the record. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator SCHNEIDER: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, before we went into a break we spoke regarding the furnishing versus trafficking issue, which I just want to state for the record that really wasn't my issue with this particular piece of legislation. There were a couple of statements made, or speeches given, that were very passionate about the problem of the bath salts issue in our state. I'm only a few miles, really borderline, from Veazie to Bangor. I know Bangor has had some problems and there are some problems in my areas as well, in my Senate District. Clearly, this is a problem. That is not something that you will find any disagreement on under the Dome. There is a significant issue here. The issue that I take with the way we're doing this is that we're not really taking a global look at drugs and alcohol. Over and over again, I've found myself voting against promotion of alcohol in our state and yet this Body, almost in entirety, very many people supports promoting alcohol in our state in some way or form. We have a significant alcohol and drug abuse problem, especially with prescription drugs. It's something that I feel that we've neglected to really look at in its entirety. From my perspective, is this important? Yes. Is this more important than prescription drug abuse, than alcohol abuse, than the problems that we have with mental health issues? No. It's definitely not, but it's the flavor of the day and it's the thing that is on the headlines. We're reacting to it because it is sensationalized. The truth of the matter is we have significant problems in this state that we all must look for and address. I hope that in this discussion that's going to apparently happen next session, or this coming January, which has to do with the furnishing versus trafficking issue, that there is a much bigger issue to look at here, which is that we need to start asking ourselves if, public policy wise, we are effectively attacking this issue, addressing this issue. Has the war on drugs worked? We're spending millions of dollars to keep people incarcerated. The question becomes, is the cost and benefit worth the way we are addressing this issue? This is not only a Maine issue. This is also a national problem and one that I don't think has been effectively addressed. We talk a lot about education and early childhood education. We neglect to fund that appropriately. There are lots of funding priorities that we are neglecting under the Dome. We're probably in violation of our own Constitution right now because we do not have the money. We need to start looking at prioritizing and how we're going to spend this money. I also object when we have this kind of issue crop up, when we know we have a prescription drug issue, we know we have substance abuse problems in Maine, but all of a sudden, for this issue, the issue of the moment, miraculously money appears when we are told over and over again that there is no money for things like indigent legal services, mental health issues, and so on. I'm only here for this next year. I leave it with you who are going to be here in the future and I hope that somebody in this Body will carry on and look at this issue in a much more global perspective because I don't think we've done a lot of cost benefit analysis of programs that we have with regard to business

development programs and TIFs and all kinds of things. The question is, will this past muster, the way we are doing this? Will this pass the straight face test when it comes to the cost and the ultimate benefit? I'm going to support this, but I'm doing it with the hope that in the future that Senators will come back and really address this more completely. I appreciate your time. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator ROSEN: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I would simply like to address what I know is an issue that has been expressed by members of the Chamber and the other Body related to the cost associated to the bill, the fiscal note, and the process that we've just gone through, specifically tied to the cost and the fiscal impact. I would remind members, first of all, that what we're dealing with, what we just dealt with down in the Appropriations Committee and what we have before us, is a bill that enhances current penalties. I appreciate the comments of the previous speaker, talking about more comprehensive approaches and setting priorities and substance abuse, in general. We have a relatively new process in the fiscal review of bills that are proposing to increase or enhance criminal penalties. That is one that started a few years ago. A former member of the Appropriations Committee, former Attorney General Janet Mills, really spearheaded the effort to put together a mechanism where we begin to attach, to the best of our ability, cost estimates for criminal enhancements and move away from basically allowing the legislative Body and the Chief Executive to enhance crimes and, ultimately, costs that are associated with that in terms of longer incarceration time and all the rest and then have the members of the Appropriations Committee years later hear from the Corrections Department, saying their population is increasing and the demand for their services in the prison system is increasing because of all these enhanced criminal penalties. To deal with that in a more forthright and objective manner, we, being previous legislators, developed a mechanism to try to provide an estimate, and, if there is associated costs, to fund it up front. That's what we have done here with this fiscal note. We had a very good conversation downstairs with the Fiscal Office. I know much of that was also dealt with Monday in the Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee, when they had the public hearing on the bill, to better understand the costs. I, as one member of the committee, am certainly satisfied with the more detailed explanation that we received from the Fiscal Office of how these figures were calculated and how they were arrived at. It, I think, is a very fair, very straight forward, very positive effort to provide a realistic estimate. There are some that felt the costs that were estimated and attached to this bill are too low and there are others that feel that it is too high. It's a bit unusual, because I know generally when we see a fiscal note on a bill, the Fiscal Office downstairs gets a lot of complaints that it's too high and to remove the fiscal note so the bill has a better chance on the table. This has brought a little bit different flavor to the discussion. I would remind folks, however, that we have what I think is a fair calculation. We have a calculated, unappropriated surplus in FY 12 and FY 13 that is sufficient to fund these costs of \$31,000 in FY 12 and \$176,000 in FY 13. We have room in our unappropriated surplus to fund it. How is it that we're able to fund it, or choose to fund it? It is because it is the will of the Legislature. It's simply that. We have a 13 - 0 report out of the

policy committee. We have an overwhelming vote in the House. We have what maybe a strong vote in the Senate. In terms of establishing priorities, our job, in Appropriations, was presented to us. The Legislature has stated, through its actions today, that this is a priority. We are telling you, based on our best estimates of the cost, we have funds available to pay for it. I will add to that, and remind you that when we do come back in January, we most likely will be dealing with a supplemental budget and, for the broader discussion and the other issues that have been talked about, both related to the potential cost associated with this bill and substance abuse in general, we have opportunities to deal with that in January. Cloture is Friday, so there is still an opportunity for people with bill submissions for that matter. I would like to comfort folks around the fiscal process as best I can. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Trahan.

Senator TRAHAN: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I've been really surprised by some of the comments and some of the testimony on the Senate floor today. I did circulate for you an article in the Bangor Daily News today about bath salts. Bath salts, it says in the article, first emerged earlier this year. Above that it has a headline that says "Use has exploded, State Police officials." We here rely on public safety, people within our communities, and leaders within our hospitals to give us guidance on important issues like this. All of them are telling us there is a problem. I feel like, from some of the comments, that some feel we're failing in this bill, that we are moving too quickly, that we might just be acting on headlines. We aren't acting on headlines and I reject that testimony. We are reacting to issues in our communities, issues brought forward by police, by the Chief Executive, by our two U.S. Senators, by EMS, and by ambulance EMTs. All of them are telling us there is a problem. I want to thank the Chief Executive and the Representative sitting behind me for taking a leadership role, both in this state and nationally. While other states still are yet to deal with this issue, Maine leads. I reject all the negative comments. I'm proud to be part of a Legislature that takes the initiative to stop this thing dead in its tracks. Some will criticize this as too harsh. You cannot be too harsh when it's your loved one in the emergency room, someone you raised from an infant, and when everything you fought so hard and responsibly to get that child to where they are goes up in smoke. Our loved ones, our families, are touched by this. I think I'm proud, I know I'm proud to vote on this bill. Will we continue to do more? Absolutely, but it won't be because there was a promise made in the back room to do it. It will be because it's the right thing to do. Every single one of us in this room care, we care passionately, about our families and loved ones. I think we should refrain from those negative comments and work as a team to stop this thing dead in its tracks, reject, and lead this nation. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Gerzofsky.

Senator **GERZOFSKY**: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, we're not even close to failing at anything. We're actually succeeding. This Body and the other end voted for virtually this same bill last year. My committee voted for virtually the same bill last year. We took it very seriously. We listened to the DEA and we listened to the DAs that came in front of us. If we failed at anything it might have been not saying just how fast this drug, that started in Asia and went through Europe and the U.K., got here. Sometimes I forget that we are the closest landing strips to Europe. While very few other states have done anything, last year we certainly did. When we saw this epidemic and crisis hit us, I think the second floor took it seriously and they reached out to try to make legislation that would work, that we could get through, and take care of it. The third floor certainly took this seriously. I know my committee did. Last year, while we voted literally for the same bill we're voting for tonight, we had a funding issue. I congratulated most of the Appropriations members that I had talked with last year in the last couple of days of session. Through their infinite wisdom, they found a way to keep this bill alive because we didn't fund it. They had to come up with the funding and they did the best they could with the tools they had. They could have gone a different way. They could have killed it for the lack of funds, but they didn't. They gave us the best that they could give us at the time. I congratulate them today. They worked so hard last year at the end of session to try to find a way to preserve this legislation. They did a good job. I don't think anybody saw the impact that this was going to have in a few short months.

This past Summer this was a legal drug in the state of Maine. You could legally buy it in my hometown in a store and pay sales tax on it. In a few months it became illegal and in a few months we saw the explosion hit our state. We're trying to respond responsibly. I don't think we failed at anything. We came to the table and we're trying to deal with it. Funding is always going to be a problem. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, believe me, next year you'll have another flavor of the month because designer drugs are just that, designer drugs that are going to have a different name and they are going to change some small component and we're going to be here trying to deal with that epidemic. This is the future that I think not only the state of Maine has to deal with, but I think it's a future that the country and probably most of the world is going to have to deal with. Some people just have to do drugs. Some people just get addicted to drugs. There is no good part of any of these drugs. They were never meant for medical purposes. These drugs were only meant to be used in the worst way possible.

I'm not going to sit here today thinking that we have not done anything because we did last year, Mr. President. It was virtually the same thing. We saved the best part of the bill that we could in Appropriations. They worked very hard at trying to find enough funds to keep it going. If it wasn't for their efforts last year, I don't know where we would have been this Summer because it would have been a legal drug still today. It would still have been sold and we still would have gotten sales taxes off of it, which is a shame. Today this Body has debated it most of the day, even though the big subject was going to be redistricting. It's going onto 8 o'clock. I certainly wanted to be home by 5 o'clock. I know everybody else in here wanted to be home by 4 o'clock. The big debate had to be of a drug that we're calling bath salts. Let me tell you, the addicts are calling it monkey dust, donkey tracks, and everything else because it was sold in head shops and the buyers, I think, were young people going into head shops. There was an inventory in June that I wish that we had had the foresight to have taken away from them and burned. That's the issue that we're going to have. This Body has always taken this drug seriously I think from the get go. I know my committee did. I know the sponsors. No matter who brought these bills in, they've

been brought in by both sides of the aisle, they've been responsible. I think this Body has. I would hope that we could get onto a vote and get out of here by 8 o'clock because we're here for public safety and this is going to be a vote that's going to give us some. Thank you very much.

Senator **PLOWMAN** of Penobscot was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate off the Record.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Goodall.

Senator GOODALL: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I rise today just to, in essence, close the loop upon what the good Minority Leader spoke earlier about in this debate. about the important policy components of this bill and what we see as needed when we were trying to get our hands around the global, larger issue that the good Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider, also spoke about. I respectfully disagree with the good Senator from Lincoln about some of us feeling we're being too harsh. We all open the paper almost daily in great shock and awe, disgust and sadness, depending on our relationship to the given town or the given individual. We want this, and I believe we're probably all overwhelmingly unanimously going to be supporting this, Democrats and Republicans. We must combat this issue, along with all of our drug issues, because so many drugs are impacting our families, fellow citizens, our state, and our community. That's what we're debating here today. We're not debating if we're being too harsh. We're pointing out that we must continue to work at this. We must continue to fight the war on drugs because if we do that we'll all succeed and we'll have a healthier and a safer state. That's the point that's being made here tonight and that's our responsibility, as a Legislature. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is Enactment. A Roll Call has been ordered. Is the Senate ready for the question?

The Doorkeepers secured the Chamber.

Senator **DIAMOND** of Cumberland was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator DIAMOND: Thank you Mr. President. Very, very briefly. June 28th I reported to the Body about a very serious concern in the state of Maine, a \$47.9 million contract with Harris Corporation to implement a new radio system. The biggest concern there was if they could get the required 302 frequencies that were required by December of this year. It's a very serious issue. We've gone though, in this state, massive computer programs that cost \$50 million and \$60 million and they have failed twice. Now we're looking at a contract for \$47.9 million that I'm very concerned about. My report to you is this; of the 302 frequencies that are required, and they agreed, they being OIT, that should be by this December, they have 48. They had 40 three months ago. They are now at 48 of those 302 frequencies. I just put that on the record, Mr. President, so that we don't lose sight. This is an issue that is coming at us. I'm very, very concerned about it and just wanted the Body to be concerned as well. Thank you, Mr. President.
