REVEREND WILCOX: Thank you Mr. President. Holy and Wondrous God, we thank You for this world You have made and how much of it we are able to enjoy here in Maine. From fields and forests to mountains and rugged coastlines, from lakes and countryside to our livable cities. From Fort Kent and Calais to Kittery and Fryeburg. We so much enjoy Your handiwork. We confess we have at times taken this land and its treasures for granted, missing how fragile life really can be. We confess we have not always appreciated our common humanity, seeking instead to often to put people in boxes and categories, hearing without always listening, seeing without always understanding, speaking without always thinking, judging without always walking in someone else's shoes, about always doing unto others as we would have done to us. Yet You are gracious beyond what we can understand and so we pray for Your forgiveness and guidance, grateful that even when we stumble You welcome us with open arms. At a time such as this, we particularly uphold today the memory of Elsie Emery, Senator Diamond's mother and Senator McCormick's mother-in-law. We uphold them and their families and their friends in our prayers. We also pause for a few moments to offer these thoughts and prayers for those in need today. At a time such as this, we know we have times here in this Body and in this building for conversation, for deliberation and debate, for legislation and serving. In the midst of it all we acknowledge we are under pressure from many directions to act in a great many ways. We have a tradition in Maine, that we've continued to experience recently and over the years, of striving to act according to the common good. In this time of political, economic, and social

change here in Maine and across our country, give us the courage, we pray, to do our work in ways that cross lines of party and ideology, across regional lines in our state, across lines of vocation, class, race, and gender that so often are used to divide us. Help us see the common humanity in our colleagues and staff, on both sides of the aisle and in the members of the Administration and the people who work so hard on the people's behalf. For those business people, students, workers, tradespeople, parents, caregivers, and people who give their energies to a great many community organizations, may we, with Your help, strive with as much passion for what will work for all concerned as we do for those values we hold so dear. May we be a voice for the voiceless, those without the money or power influence to be a large voice, but who are just as significant in our communities. May we understand that the image of Your grace is present in each face and may we hold ourselves to a high standard, even as we expect mutual accountability in our common work. You know we have difficult decisions to make about budgets, policies, and a variety of bills. We pray for Your presence and peace as we continue to work with our legislative process. Give us patience and insight for the road ahead. At a time such as this, as we contemplate Winter's late arrival and perhaps more snow tomorrow, we realize it won't be long until our thoughts begin to turn to Spring. May we be renewed by Your strength and spirit, refreshed and enlivened for the work that awaits us on behalf of those whom we serve. It is in Your gracious name we pray these things and so many others in Your name. Amen.
