JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING JANUARY 25TH AS EITC AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS, in order to promote the federal earned income tax credit, which enhances family household budgets, we recognize January 25, 2013 as EITC Awareness Day; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that every year 20 percent of Maine residents do not apply for the federal earned income tax credit, which demonstrates the importance of raising awareness of this credit and urging individuals to find out if they qualify for it; and

WHEREAS, throughout the State, IRS-certified volunteer tax preparers who are members of CA\$H Maine and AARP Tax-Aide, a collaboration of 11 statewide coalitions including 50 nonprofit and for-profit partners, provide free federal and state tax preparation; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, these volunteers helped Maine residents save more than \$1,700,000 in filing fees and claim \$5,670,000 in earned income tax credits, returning \$20,000,000 to Maine residents in federal income tax refunds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-sixth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize January 25, 2013 as EITC Awareness Day; and be it further

RESOLVED: That we send our appreciation to all the volunteers who participate in EITC Awareness Day for the benefit of Maine citizens and we urge participation in this worthy cause.

Senator **HASKELL**: Thank you Mr. President. This is a very important federal program that about 20% of people in the state of Maine who are eligible don't take advantage of. I'd like to encourage my colleagues here in the Senate to consider in their communications with their constituents to encourage them to look for these tax preparation events that are occurring, to take advantage of what Ca\$h Maine and the AARP Tax-Aide programs provide for people. It's an important advantage and it

has been considered one of the largest anti-poverty programs in the country. I would encourage you. If your constituents are looking for to find one of these events please encourage them to dial 211 and they will be directed to the appropriate resources or to one of the free tax preparation events that will be going on. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Goodall.

Senator **GOODALL**: Thank you Mr. President. Today I rise and speak to this Joint Resolution honoring and memorializing Carlton Day Reed, commonly known to many as Bud as well as Mr. President when he was here in this Body. He was elected to the House of Representatives and then later elected to this Body in 1964 when he was the first Democrat to serve as the Senate President in 54 years. Mr. Reed was a wonderful man, a true gentleman, and one that really left a lasting impact both on his family and his business and the entire state and in numerous entities he was involved with. He helped really expand Reed and Reed, a company that many of us are familiar with. It is a company that is in my district, located in Woolwich. Reed and Reed, to many of us, is known for their success and growth in the wind power industry as well as their expertise in construction, mainly bridges and other types of engineering. In addition to being the Senate President and a member of the House, he was also deeply passionate about education and served on the State Board of Education and was a University of Maine trustee. In addition to that, he also was a trustee of Canal Bank, KeyCorp, and Central Maine Power and also served as Chair of that board. In fact, his independent nature as a board member was highlighted by the Wall Street Journal and really complimented him on his work as an independent board, one looking out for both the interest of the companies as well as the shareholders. Most importantly, as I just mentioned, his deepest devotion was to family. He had six children, nineteen grandchildren, and he would do anything for them. When I, along with many others, attended his funeral it was amazing how much this man could accomplish. He was often at the ice rink at 5 or 6 am with his kids or his grandkids. He was then in the shop at Reed and Reed, often down in a ditch with a shovel showing his workers how to do it right, and later attending boards on which he served or here in this Body. It's just a true honor to stand and speak today. recognizing this fine gentleman and former President of the Maine State Senate. Thank you, Mr. President.
