PASTOR CAMPBELL: Good morning. Thank you very much. It was a pleasure to meet you, President Alfond. It is a pleasure to be here with you, Maine Senators. If you don't mind, with your permission, I'd like to offer a brief introduction to the prayer to set it in a proper tone for hearing.

As usual, the red light was blinking on my phone when I got to the church office. The first message was from Ashley, inviting me to come here to pray with you this morning. The next seven messages were all from Sadie, calling for help. A food card, a gas card, something to help her bridge the gap between benefits and basic needs for her 6-year old granddaughter, Iris, and for herself. Seven messages. I called back and said yes to Ashley and yes to Sadie. Then I invited Sadie and Iris to come with me today. It seemed like the right thing to do. I wrote a prayer for us to read together and Iris asked if she could bring you a plant that she had repotted all by herself. I was beginning to wonder whether their presence here was the real invocation after all until Sadie got sick and cancelled at the last minute. Sometimes Plan A, as good as it seems, just doesn't work and circumstances call for Plan B. This happens in ministry and I suppose it happens in your line of work. Plan B for me is a pray written by Maren Tirabassi and Joan Grant entitled simply Prayer with Political Leaders. It was inspired by the temptations of Christ in the wilderness; temptations to forget who and whose he was and why he had come. So I invite you to keep Sadie and Iris in mind as you hear these words. Please join me in a spirit of prayer.

Gracious God, we are tempted to promise bread, bread, bread, in whatever form is longed for when we know that there are only stones, stones, stones. It isn't just the desire to win votes or even just to please the public, deep in us we want abundance for people; easy, miracle like abundance would be preferred. Bread would feed them and would make us loved, so we are tempted to promise bread. Gentle God, we are tempted to worship someone else, a poll-powerful God, a proven effective leader God, a God who gives a sign when asked God, a God communicator who awes the Pontius Pilates of this world. Yes, we could handle the whole realms of power, not for bad things, not for ourselves, but because we could use power for good. God, empower us for justice. Empower us as peacemakers. Empower us to serve the poor. Empower us to save the nation, the state, the city. Empower us, empower us, empower us. No, unpower us, O God, to become servants. Keep us honest, open to the best ideas of any political party, willing to compromise and commit public image suicide if necessary. Lead us by Your spirit, sometimes to a lonely place. Feed us by the angels. Strengthen

us against the obvious demons and against the subtle tempting of both the evil and the benevolent. God of David and Esther, God of the King of the Jews, You see our hearts. Cleanse them. You know our minds. Keep them discerning. Keep us healthy in body and spirit, that we may bring honor to this complicated and difficult profession, offering injustice in our decisions, humility in our opinions, compassion for those in need, and respect for all the people we seek to serve. Gracious, gentle, unpowering God, hear our prayer. Amen.

RESOLVED: That we encourage all members of the community to discuss data privacy and security with vulnerable citizens throughout the State, we encourage all people to learn about data privacy and the specific steps they can take to protect the privacy of their personal information and we encourage businesses and agencies to commit to better protect the privacy and security of the personal information of their clients and consumers and to design data privacy into products they create whenever possible.
