JOINT RESOLUTION TO ACKNOWLEDGE FEBRUARY 11. 2013 AS A DAY OF REFLECTION, MEDITATION AND PRAYER TO SUPPORT THE PURPOSE AND WORK OF THE MAINE WABANAKI-STATE CHILD WELFARE TRUTH AND **RECONCILIATION COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, the Aroostook Band of Micmacs, the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians, the Passamaquoddy Tribe at Sipayik, the Passamaguoddy Tribe at Motahkmikuk, the Penobscot Indian Nation and the State of Maine have signed a mandate to implement a truth and reconciliation commission; and

WHEREAS, the Maine Wabanaki-State Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission represents a historic agreement to uncover and acknowledge the truth about what happened to Wabanaki children and families who were involved with the Maine child welfare system, to create opportunities to heal and learn from the truth and to collaborate to operate the best child welfare system possible for Wabanaki children and families; and

WHEREAS, the 5 commissioners charged to undertake this work will be sworn in during a public Seating of the Commission Ceremony on Tuesday, February 12, 2013 in the Town of Hermon; and

WHEREAS, the day before the Seating of the Commission Ceremony, Monday, February 11, 2013, has been designated as a day of reflection, meditation and prayer to support the purpose and work of the Maine Wabanaki-State Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and the commissioners and the commission's convening group will gather with spiritual leaders to prepare themselves for the work ahead; and

WHEREAS, the Maine Wabanaki-State Truth and Reconciliation Commission invites people to join in reflection, meditation or prayer as their own faith and traditions direct them, to consider the opportunity the commission will provide to deepen human respect and compassion in hearing the truth of our shared history, to pray for the healing of deep and ancient wounds and to call for courage, clarity of purpose and openness; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-sixth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, declare our support for the Maine Wabanaki-State Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission and its worthy efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED: That we join the Maine Wabanaki-State Truth and Reconciliation Commission in reflection, meditation or prayer. stand in spiritual solidarity with the commission and understand the importance of collaboration and relationship building through this process, and we declare February 11, 2013 as a day of reflection, meditation and prayer to support the work of the Maine

Wabanaki-State Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be displayed at the Office of the Secretary of State on behalf of the people of the State of Maine and be delivered to the appropriate representatives of the Aroostook Band of Micmacs, the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians, the Passamaquoddy Tribe at Sipayik, the Passamaquoddy Tribe at Motahkmikuk and the Penobscot Nation.

Dear Mssrs. Alfond and Eves:

To conform with guidance issued by the Executive Director of the Legislative Council on January 23, 2013, I am hereby resubmitting MaineHousing's report pursuant to 5 MRSA §12023, which MaineHousing had submitted on January 18, 2013.

In compliance with 5 MRSA § 12023 on September 18, 2012, the MaineHousing Commissioners adopted policies governing: (1) procurement; (2) contributions; and (3) travel, meals and entertainment. MaineHousing staff fully implemented the policies on October 1, 2012. The Commissioners will monitor compliance as follows:

With respect to the procurement policy:

 The Director of MaineHousing must consult with the Chair or Vice Chair of the Commissioners prior to any sole source solicitation in an amount exceeding \$10,000.

- MaineHousing may enter into contracts longer than 5 years only with prior approval from the Commissioners or for purposes outlined in the policy.
- MaineHousing's Internal Auditor will provide the Commissioners' Audit Committee with a report listing all procurements exceeding \$10,000. The Internal Auditor will provide the report semiannually in 2013 and on an annual basis thereafter.

With respect to the contributions policy:

- The Director of MaineHousing must consult with the Chair of the Commissioners regarding any contributions (i.e., membership and dues, or sponsorships that result in public advertising of MaineHousing) of more than \$1,000 to any one organization in a year.
- The annual budget approved by the Commissioners includes a line item for membership dues and fees and a line item for sponsorships.
- The Commissioners receive a monthly budget variance report that includes payments for memberships and sponsorships.

With respect to the travel, meals, and entertainment policy:

- The annual budget approved by the Commissioners includes a line item for meals plus mileage reimbursement and other travel costs in connection with employee training and conferences, and property inspections; a line item for travel and meals in connection with partner trainings and meetings; a line item for meals in connection with board meetings and staff events such as all staff breakfasts, all staff days, and holiday gatherings; and a line item for leased vehicles.
- The Commissioners receive a monthly budget variance report that includes payments for each of these line items.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Boyle.

Senator BOYLE: Thank you Mr. President. I rise today to honor the memory of Hank Hamblen, Jr. of Dingley Springs Road in Gorham who passed away on Sunday, December 2, 2012, at the Gosnell Memorial Hospice surrounded by his family. With us today is Hank's wife, Debby; his sisters, Marcena, Karen, and Ruth; his brothers-in-law, Rick and Ed. His father-in-law, David. Also with us is Gorham Fire Chief Lefebvre and many of Hank's fellow firefighters from Gorham and Westbrook and nieces and Hank's nephew. A lifelong resident of Gorham, Hank attended local schools and graduated from the University of Southern Maine in 1973 with a degree in history and English. He later attended firefighting school in Presque Isle, where he found his true calling. Hank was a volunteer member of the Gorham Fire Department for 39 years and exemplified their values of dignity, respect, honesty, compassion, and kindness. He was a paramedic and volunteered on the Gorham Rescue. One of his proudest moments was responding to a call and helping to deliver a healthy baby girl. For several years after college, he worked as dispatcher for the town of Gorham and in 1987 he went to work for the City of Westbrook Fire Department and spent the last 25 years as a firefighter/paramedic based at the Prides Corner Station in Westbook. It is a testament to Hank's strong lifelong connection to Gorham and Westbrook that many of his family and fellow firefighters are here today to honor him. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Haskell.

Senator HASKELL: Thank you Mr. President. Mr. President and colleagues in the Senate, I met Hank and whole Hamblen clan, as a matter of fact, when Hank was in high school when we first moved to Gorham and we became friends with his mother and father. I remember him going off to college and I even remember that brief stint he had at teaching. That was not what was in Hank's heart. What was in his heart was the fire department. He loved it from the time he was a kid and all the way until the very last day. When he was talking with my daughter-in-law, actually, on the last few days of his life a lot of it was about the fire department. Those who are sitting here know that. The people of Westbrook and Gorham were so well served when Hank was on the call. He knew his stuff. He was always calm and he could put people at ease. More than once, I'm sure, people heard, "Oh hi, Hank. Glad you are here," with their broken leg or their chest pain or whatever it was. They knew it was Hank and he was there. I know that for sure, very personally, with the calls that he responded to at my house. There was a very true local connection when Hank was on the call. He actually took the pictures at my 25th wedding anniversary at The Roost. Do you remember that one, guys? I think probably some folks do. When people in my family would look at the pictures of our 25th anniversary they would say, "Well, who's this and who's that?" I would say, "That is Hamblen so-and so, and that is Hamblen soand-so." There were just as many Hamblen's in that picture as there were Larrabee's. I can tell you that is because when there are close neighbors like the Hamblen's and the Larrabee's were that's what it was like, like we were a family. I won't tell all the stories today, but I will talk about Hank. He was a model of humility always. He was never boastful. He was always helpful. He was always calm and he was always so capable. He will be sorely missed by his family, by his colleagues, and by his community. Treasures like this in our state are hard to come by. people who are devoted as they are to public service. I would respectfully request that when the Senate adjourns today they do it in honor and memory of Hank Hamblen. Thank you.
