THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Burns.

Senator BURNS: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I just want to very briefly speak to this issue. I felt the need to speak on this. I realize where this is going when this Body Insists. I co-sponsored this bill because I thought it had merit. I thought it had potential to do some good. I didn't see any way that it was going to do any harm. As you know, the bill would authorize the increase of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Academy. It would add one position, from 17 to 18, to represent several of our tribes, Native American tribes, in this state. I thought that that was an opportunity to open some better communication, better cooperation between the tribes and the criminal justice system in our state. I've worked with the Passamaquoddy tribe and other tribes since 1971 and their law enforcement and the criminal justice system. They have come a long way in these years, from having Constables to eventually having police departments. They used to send their officers out west to be trained with other Native Americans. Now they train them at the Criminal Justice Academy. They represent a large portion of our population here in the state of Maine; a very important population in my district, two Indian reservations. This would have been an opportunity, I think, to improve the cooperation that we now enjoy between the tribes and the criminal justice and law enforcement community. If this fails, and it appears that is its destiny, I hope this Body, and I know I'm going to, will pursue other avenues to improve that cooperation. I know that there are seats available on the Board of Trustees for the Chief as well as citizen members. I think it would be very good for our state, as a whole, and certainly for the criminal justice system to have one of their people being represented on those. I hope you will work me on that venture. Thank you very much, Mr. President, for the opportunity.

Senator LANGLEY: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I missed the chance to speak on this the last time around. I was out in the hallway. I beg your indulgence. I wanted to speak on this issue mostly because of the inspiration I got from watching the movie Lincoln. It really connected with me because of our service here in the Legislature. I wondered what we would have done, sitting in this Body, back around the time of the Civil War. I've been doing a little research on our Governor at that time, Israel Washburn from Livermore Falls. Israel had come to this Body in about 1830. Served here a number of terms. In 1842 he was elected to Congress. Served in the 32nd, 33rd, 34th, and on up to the 36th. He came back to Maine and was elected Governor in 1860. I read some of his speeches to the Joint Convention about rallying Maine and getting the word out for Maine's troops. In my mind, Maine played a huge part in getting folks and getting troops. They were convened right outside the State House, off the balcony in that long lawn across the way. Where we had served such an important part in the Civil War and sending our troops, we sent the most percentage of anybody, I felt that we have a connection more than maybe a lot of other states do. That's where my support of this comes from. Thank you for your indulgence.

JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL 2013 AS AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, autism is a spectrum disorder, which means no 2 people with autism are affected the same way, and it is a complex developmental disability that usually appears during the first 3 years of life and results in a neurological disorder that affects the functioning of the brain; and

WHEREAS, autism affects social interaction and communication skills, and an average of 1 in 88 children are diagnosed with this spectrum disorder, and prevalence has increased 78% since the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's first study in 2007; and

WHEREAS, autism knows no racial, ethnic or social boundaries and neither income, lifestyle nor education affects the occurrence, and it is estimated that 1,500,000 people live with autism spectrum disorder in the United States; and

WHEREAS, autism costs the United States \$90,000,000,000 in annual health care costs; 90% of the costs are in adult services. These costs are estimated to increase in 10 years to \$200,000,000,000 to \$400,000,000,000; and

WHEREAS, a single specific cause of autism is not known, but current research links it to biological or neurological differences in the brain, and outdated theories and myths, such as autism being a mental illness, have been proven to be false; and

WHEREAS, with support, people with autism can live full lives and make meaningful contributions to society; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-sixth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, pause in our deliberations to acknowledge that the month of April 2013 is Autism Awareness Month and to pledge our support and encouragement to the assistance of all those affected by autism; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Autism Society of Maine as a token of our respect and support.
