Thomas L. Welch, of Hancock, on the occasion of his retirement as Chair of the Maine Public Utilities Commission after many years of dedicated service to the people of Maine. Mr. Welch was appointed as Chair of the Maine Public Utilities Commission by Governor McKernan in 1993, and he was reappointed by Governor King in 1999. He served until 2005 and then was reappointed in 2011 by Governor LePage. Between his commission appointments, he worked as an attorney for a private law firm and served as an adjunct professor at the University of Maine School of Law. He is widely respected for his experience and expertise in utility and energy matters and is known for his intellect, his integrity, his judicial temperament and his willingness to assist policy makers with complicated utility regulation issues. He served as Assistant Professor at Villanova School of Law from 1978 to 1979 and from 1982 to 1991 served the Bell Atlantic Company, rising to the post of General Attorney in Washington, D.C. From 1991 to 1993, he served the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as Chief Deputy Attorney General for Antitrust. Mr. Welch has served during a time of the greatest changes in the history of Maine's traditional utilities, including the transition from monopoly to competition, enduring recessions and rising costs and encompassing the deregulation and restructuring of Maine's electrical industry, competition in telecommunications, the creation of Maine's pioneering Schools and Libraries Fund to extend Internet access to all our communities, Maine's becoming one of the first states in the nation to deploy a statewide Next Generation 911 system designed to keep pace with the way people communicate today and regional efforts to increase the flow of natural gas into New England in an effort to lower energy costs for electricity and natural gas customers. We send our appreciation to Mr. Welch for his many years of commitment and dedicated public service to the citizens of Maine.
