On behalf of the Permanent Commission on the Status of Women, please find our 2015 Report on the Status of Women and Girls in Maine for your review and consideration.

As you may know, the nonpartisan Commission was established in Maine statute in 2010 and charged with advising the state's policy makers on issues that are relevant to the state's female population. Our members hail from many different backgrounds and represent a variety of perspectives.

This report, our second, reflects our collaborative effort to analyze available data surrounding five policy dimensions (education; economic security; health; safety & wellbeing; and leadership & public life), as well as an analysis of direct input from Maine women and girls. Together, this information has formed the basis for our policy recommendations, which you will find at the beginning of our report.

We hope to have the opportunity to discuss our findings and recommendations with you during this legislative session, and will follow up with your office about scheduling a meeting time. In the meantime, we respectfully offer ourselves up as a resource for vou in the important work that you do to move Maine forward.

I would also say that Tate has put in incredibly long hours, worked incredibly hard, done a great job, and deserves this honor, as does her family for taking her to the games, following the games, being involved.

It says a lot for the work eithic, both of Tate and Logan and the young people we have here today, that they can get these accomplishments and be honored in such a way. I think sometimes we lose sight of the simple things, and we ought to respect that and honor it and give our deepest congratulations to Tate here as well. So, please join me in doing so.

the Honorable Peter Danton, of Saco, a former State Senator and Deputy Secretary of State. Mr. Danton served 7 terms in the Maine State Senate, from 1971 to 1980 and from 1983 to 1986, serving as Assistant Minority Leader from 1973 to 1978. He also served on the board of the Maine Turnpike Authority, as Chief of Staff to Governor Joseph Brennan, as Deputy Secretary of State, as Chair of the State Liquor and Lottery Commission and as Chair of the Gambling Control Board. Before his public service began, Mr. Danton was a restaurateur, beginning by working in his family's restaurant at the age of 14. He went on to open his own restaurants in Old Orchard Beach and other towns along the State's southern coast. We acknowledge Mr. Danton's long service in the Legislature and to the State. Mr. Danton will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family and friends and his colleagues from the Legislature and elsewhere in State Government;

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Saco, Representative Hobbins.

Representative HOBBINS: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. Women and Men of this Body, it is with great respect and loyalty that I have known Peter Danton all of my adult life, and in fact I first met Peter Danton when he saw my mother and father when I was a baby carriage going down his home town of Saco, Maine.

Peter Danton has had a remarkable life journey. From a cold water flat in Biddeford on Foss Street to being a State Senator; being a legislative leader; being a Deputy Secretary of State; numerous other appointed positions by six different governors of the State of Maine since 1970.

He was considered to be a leader, not only here in his home district of Saco and the communities he represented, but he was really one of the major leaders within the Greek-American community, which he was so proud to be part of. His heritage meant a great deal to him, and his success and his overachieving in life was something that made him proud and made his family and made the citizens of his legislative districts extremely proud.

I think that there's another factor that you didn't see in this legislative sentiment in honor of Peter, and that is, in his 50's he went back to college and received an Associate's degree and also a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Maine at Augusta. I think that's remarkable, that someone who started working in his little past ten years of age, would think enough and respect enough of the educational process that he wanted to have that as part of his life being.

So, it is with pride that I am on and sponsored this, along with Senator Valentino and also the good Representative from Saco, because it's extremely, I think it's extremely with pride that all of us who have ever known Peter involved in the political process, felt of him as not only a guiding light, a mentor, but also a friend. He will be sorely missed by those he served in all the different appointments throughout state government and to those he's mentored-from the dishwasher at the Hitching Post Restaurant to being Chief of Staff of Joe Brennan.

His funeral was a proud moment, and he would've been proud except for the long speech that was given by former President Gerard P. Conley, who was a close friend of his. He would've been upset that President Conley went on so long, but there was a lot to praise Peter Danton for, and he would be proud to say that that dishwasher from the Hitching Post along with two former governors were there to pay their last respects. So, Peter, this is the Legislator's way to say "Goodbye and thank you."

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative

from Saco, Representative Chenette.

Representative CHENETTE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. As the good Representative from Saco, Representative Hobbins said, our community and state has lost a great man and public servant this past week, the former Senator Peter Danton of Saco.

I considered Peter a close mentor, as did many in politics, and I've only known him a few years, but he had such a profound impact on my life. He would frequently visit our legislative office in Saco meeting with Senator Valentino, and Representative Hobbins and myself on various bills and the political gossip behind the scenes. He was always curious about that.

He would also help us provide insight and was always there if you needed him, both in our campaigns and our legislative work. During my first run for office back in 2012, it was an honor to

have his blessing and support throughout it all. Having that kind of wavering support from someone who has been in your shoes is important, not just in politics, but in life. It's not something you forget, either.

I came to expect his smile, his voice on an almost weekly basis. He was a constant presence in our political lives until the very end. He never let his health deter him from his insatiable curiosity for the constantly changing information landscape, always pondering, questioning, and reaffirming his place in our Maine society, limitless beyond any title bestowed upon him throughout his life.

Peter's legacy of putting people first and helping those most in need will live on in the halls up here in Augusta and in our community back home in Saco. He will be missed not only by those closest loved ones, but also by those lucky individuals who got a glimpse of Peter's caring spirit and insight. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Old Orchard Beach, Representative Hogan.

Representative **HOGAN**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, Senator Danton was a friend of mine, a very, very good friend. We talked almost weekly about things that are going on.

Recently, he called me, about two weeks ago, "Georgie," that's what he called me, I called him Pete. "Georgie, I have an idea on the budget. Can you meet with me?" So, I did, and we did talk.

So, Pete got along with everybody. He was generous, he was kind, he was very helpful. Pete contributed to a lot of campaigns, including many on the other side. And, I asked him one time, "Pete, why do you do that?" And he said, "You never know when you're going to need a favor." So, that's the way Pete thought.

Pete loved to laugh. And, he told me some stories, one recently about when he was serving way back when. You could smoke in the chambers. In fact, I guess it must've been encouraged because everybody had an ashtray. And then, prohibiting smoking came along, but some were addicted, they couldn't stop. One of them happened to be his President of the Senate, and he would duck down below the podium, but the thing that would give him away was the swirl of smoke going above him. And, Pete would laugh like crazy at something like that.

Peter also did a lot of things that Senator Hobbins mentioned. He was involved in a tremendous amount of things. But, Pete also was one of the founding Legislators at the University of New England, for the University of New England, as well as the York County Community College.

So, he was not only kind, generous, and he was a great Legislator, and I'll miss my friend. I called him every week, or he would call me, and I can say that he was a true, true friend in every sense of the word.
