The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Raymond, Representative McClellan.

Representative **McCLELLAN**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, this bill is appropriately before us as we move into the Fourth of July season, our celebration of independence. A time we have in the past celebrated our system of government, a grand experiment that actually changed the world. Mr. Speaker, I sponsored LD 330 upon request from a person I had never met before. We spoke, I agreed to put this bill forward. I learned a lot through this process and that's why I'm standing in support of the Minority Ought to Pass Report.

When I first put the bill in, I learned that it simply states that Maine would follow US and Maine law, the US and the Maine Constitution. I agreed to do this for them, but I also kind of laughed in my head thinking, "That surely already is the law, isn't it?" And I spoke to a few friends about this, Mr. Speaker, and I started making the joke that this would be kind of like putting a bill in that said that all Maine cars should stop at a stop sign. And then I thought about it, and I live on a hill with a stop sign at the bottom and no one ever stops at that stop sign. So, I think I learned a lot right there.

In this hearing, we had testimony from eight citizens, myself and the ACLU. All supported the bill except for one. And we heard some compelling stories, Mr. Speaker, about people that live in the United States who wanted to treat their issue in court with laws from other countries. In many cases these examples would negatively affect women, marriages and children.

So what's this bill about, Mr. Speaker? Well, it's about a system of government that was finely crafted, was God inspired and has worked like none other for a short period of time in the history of this world. This bill is about consistency, it's about people knowing, Mr. Speaker, that they can go to a Maine court and be confident they know the rules they will be treated by. A woman can go to a court in Maine and not hear that in a foreign country, their male son belongs to the father at age 10. This bill is not intended—at least by my count—this bill is not intended to specifically attack Sharia Law, Orthodox Jewish Tradition or any group or any custom. It really is meant to affirm our way of living.

Now—sadly, I'm 55—many of us grew up in a different world where there was a law and most people honored it. Today, we watch the federal government, Mr. Speaker, pick and choose which laws to enforce and which ones they're not going to enforce. And it happens in Maine, too. I don't stop at stop signs sometimes. I have blue plates though. Our system was created so that we would all be treated equal. And yes, I know, and we heard in the debate, that's not always worked well in this country. So, isn't it important that we affirm that the rules that exist today are the same for Presidents and for people that are homeless, for anybody that you know. This is the Constitution we all swore to uphold.

The bill is straight forward, the analyst in the Judiciary Committee actually drafted it for me, and at least 10 states have passed this legislation. We affirm things in this House all the time and this is no different. And in this changing world, Mr. Speaker, this bill gives you a chance to stand for our rule of law in Maine. The argument in the committee against this bill wasn't really an argument, it was simply that yes, there are challenges going on in the United States, but it doesn't really seem to be happening in Maine at this point. Well, since this bill, and this bill actually was heard many months ago, since this bill happened, Mr. Speaker, there was recently—maybe two weeks ago—an attack in Boston of a police officer where the intent was to cut his head off. Luckily, it didn't happen. Right now, Mr. Speaker, since this bill was heard, in Texas there's a case where a father is defending himself for killing, allegedly, his daughter's boyfriend and best friend in what is termed an "honor killing." His defense is, "It's an honor killing. These people shamed my family and so I can kill them." And finally, in New York, there's a case recently where a woman who lives in an orthodox Jewish society, her husband decided to just ostracize her. He would not divorce her and it basically froze her out of almost every part of that society. And people are saying, Mr. Speaker, that, currently, all of these cases are being successfully covered in our court system. However, given my opinion, today's activist judicial system, what will happen in Maine if even one of these cases goes the other way?

So, we've heard recently—with our budget process, Mr. Speaker—we've heard a lot about people coming to this country. And most of us think that's a good thing. And don't they come to this country because of the freedoms and protections we offer them, Mr. Speaker, that their previous home must not have? LD 330 provides for one simple thing, no tricks at all: that foreign law cannot be cited in our courts in Maine when to do so would violate any rights or privileges granted within our State Constitution or the US Constitution. Period. It should not be necessary to have this discussion today, but cases across the country are forcing me to stand up for this, Mr. Speaker. And I ask you today to support defeating this motion, passing LD 330 and helping to keep Maine great. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Friendship, Representative Evangelos.

Representative **EVANGELOS**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and Men and Women of the House, we heard no convincing testimony in the Judiciary Committee regarding this bill. There was one piece of emotional testimony that cited, I mean, quote, "Sharia Law," which is, you know, Islamic law overseas in some countries, which we have a total separation of church and state in this country. And no court in this country is going to honor the violation of people's liberties on the basis of any religious law, whether it be Sharia or otherwise. So, there was no evidence presented.

But I want to remind everybody that the United States is a signatory to the following conventions and treaties overseas: the Geneva Convention; the International Court of War Crimes

Against Genocide; the Convention against Torture signed by Ronald Reagan in 1988; extradition treaties with a variety of countries; the War Crimes Act of 1996. I also want to remind everybody that after the end of World War II, the Nuremberg Convention and the Nuremberg trials were conducted. The Chief Justice of that court was Robert Jackson from Ohio. The convention was written by Americans, by American justices and jurists. And it's a treaty that we're a signatory to and we're all proud of, and of course we, as Americans, want to honor our international obligations when they're based on American values. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

There was a lot of uncertainty as to what the Maine Municipal Association's position was on this bill. A number of people spoke to it and looking for clarification. I have before me the letter from the Executive Director, Geoff Herman, and, in fact, the 70-member board of the Maine Municipal Association asked for this bill to be introduced. They fully support the motion before you here today.

The second point that I want to make is the original bill would have allowed communities from 4,000 to 10,000 in population to opt out of the municipal building and energy code. This amendment that comes from the other body changes that and it requests that communities between 4,000 and 6,000 be given that opportunity; not 4,000 to 10,000. That reflects a conversation that I've had with a number of people here that really thought the initial bill was a substantial overreach.

The third is, there are a number of communities that are affected in the four to six thousand category, and I thought it'd be interesting just to note what some of those communities are. So, I have a dozen different communities here as examples: Millinocket, Pittsfield, Waldoboro, Rumford, Warren, Madison, Madawaska, Monmouth, Vassalboro, Bar Harbor, Fort Kent, and Dover-Foxcroft are all communities that would be impacted and have the ability to opt out if this particular motion is approved by this body. I ask for your support. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House.

Representative GIDEON of Freeport **REQUESTED** a roll call on the motion to **RECEDE AND CONCUR.**

And the building code reflects that. This is a way, houses that are built to code are a better investment and for most people, their house is their biggest investment. It's their



largest investment; the only way that they have something that they can pass on to their family. So, I oppose this Recede and Concur motion and ask you to vote red on it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from East Machias, Representative Tuell.

Representative **TUELL**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I just couldn't resist another local control speech, so I will make it brief. I concur with the Representative from Dover-Foxcroft. Like so many things that float between these two chambers, and these two floors, this isn't a perfect deal, but it's a fair deal. It's a little bit. It's reasonable. It doesn't go all the way, but it does something. It's very modest. It's a fair compromise. And I think, maybe, if we actually compromised a little more on things like this and others, we might get a little more done. So, thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Kittery, Representative Rykerson.

Representative **RYKERSON**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Men and Women of the House, if you want to talk about fairness, is it fair that there are many dozens of communities that have been building and constructing houses and other commercial buildings according to code, and now you're proposing that they will not be built according to code. It's uncertain as to how long it will take to prepare them, but we are anticipating multiple hours. They will have a better sense of the pace in which they can get this done after a couple hours. I would anticipate an estimate—and this is an estimate and we will be sending emails throughout the day for updates—I would say not before six o'clock, but please look at your emails.

We need to make sure that the Clerk's Office can get done with their work. They are all going to be working on this. I ask that you respect their time. If you have questions about an amendment, if that could please wait until they get through their work. We want to be fully prepared this evening when we come back in to take up the line item vetoes and the intention is to get through that this evening.

By unanimous consent, all matters having been acted upon were **ORDERED SENT FORTHWITH.**

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Oxford, Representative Dillingham, who wishes to address the House on the record.

Representative **DILLINGHAM**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Men and Women of the House, in reference to Roll Call No. 288, on LD 83, An Act To Strengthen the Consent Laws for Abortions Performed on Minors and Incapacitated Persons, had I been present, I would've voted "yea."

The SPEAKER: Before we get started this evening, I wanted to take a moment of silence to honor the victims of the terrible tragedy that struck our nation yesterday in Charleston, South Carolina. At a historic black church in that community, a gunman fatally shot six women, three men, including the pastor who was a sitting State Senator. Our thoughts and prayers tonight are with those families and communities who are deeply grieving. Please join me now in a moment of silence.

At this point, the Members of the House stood and joined in a moment of silence in honor of the victims of the tragedy at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, South Carolina.

The SPEAKER: Prior to beginning this evening on the line item vetoes, the Chair would make an announcement that we will be going through these relatively quickly. We are going to be ordering divisions. If roll calls are required, please make that known. We are going to be going through these pretty quickly so that we can do this in an efficient, timely manner. I will do my best to look at the screen and look up prior to each supplement beginning, but please understand that we will be doing divisions.

Once we have a majority—it requires a simple majority to override a line item veto—I will be closing the vote. I would encourage folks to stay in their seat, with the exception of having to go to the emergency bathroom break. But, please be very cognizant of being able to push your button very quickly once we open the vote. During the divisions, bells do not ring, so if you're out in the hallway, you will not know if we were taking up a division or not.

You will also notice, starting with Supplement 4, goes through Supplement 80. There are more than 80 line item vetoes that we are going to need to take up. There will be another batch that will come. I believe that will start with Supplement 11 with that next batch. So, we are required to recycle the numbers—not required, we have to—because of the software, another reason. So I just wanted to clue folks in to that when we get to the 80th supplement, it will go back to Supplement No. 11 and go in sequential order from there.

Dear Honorable Members of the 127th Legislature:

Under the authority vested in me by Article IV, Part Third, Section 2-A of the Constitution of the State of Maine, I am hereby executing line-item vetoes of a number of allocations contained within LD 1019, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2015, June 30, 2016 and June 30, 2017." These vetoes are included on the attached sheet.

Mainers want a budget that can be used as a blueprint for prosperity for our great state. Instead, legislators delayed the process for five months, then presented a business-as-usual budget patched together at the last minute. Secretive, late-night decisions made under the cover of darkness and behind locked

doors have led to a budget based on the best interests of a handful of politicians, not what is best for all the people of Maine. As the drug epidemic continues to ravage our state—with nearly 1,000 babies born each year addicted to drugs and 208 Mainers dead of drug overdoses in 2014—it is appalling that politicians would rather fund their own pet projects than prevent ruthless out-of-state drug traffickers from infiltrating our communities and killing our children.

Because politicians are so busy capitulating to special interests and kowtowing to social-justice activists prowling the halls of the State House, they ignore our elderly, disabled and mentally ill citizens. These Mainers are rightfully entitled to healthcare, but they are left sitting for years on waitlists without basic services. Politicians have submitted a budget that provides only \$6 million toward the waitlist, when the true need is another \$40 million—which I allocated in my original budget.

They also rejected my plan to overhaul the state's General Assistance program, which encouraged cities like Portland to spend more of local taxpayers' money so they could get more funding from the state. Politicians watered down General Assistance reform to reward cities that insist on giving local taxpayers' money to illegal aliens.

Clearly, the health and public safety of Mainers was not a priority of the 127<sup>th</sup> Legislature. Instead, Augusta politicians snuck in a \$4 million "Christmas tree" adorned with piggy projects for legislators, such as buying federal land in Kittery, building an unneeded "Francis Perkins Homestead," paying for a commission disguised as initiative to end hunger and creating entirely new projects.

Maine taxpayers deserve to know how every dollar of their money is being spent, but this "Christmas tree" with gifts for certain legislators was presented with no public notice or input. This is exactly the kind of back-room politics the people of Maine sent me here to prevent.

Too many Augusta politicians are willing to disenfranchise the Maine people in exchange for feeding off the public trough, even at the expense of our most vulnerable and needy citizens. The days of pork-barrel spending—and Christmas in June—must end. At the very least, I will bring these politicians' actions to light for Mainers to see.

My administration has been working for five years to create an efficient government, but that is an oxymoron to Augusta politicians. They must put aside their petty political agendas and put the hard-working people of Maine first. Mainers deserve to have a say in how their money is being used, and they should be included in the budgeting process. I took my budget directly to the people of Maine, holding public town hall meetings up and down the state.

Until Augusta politicians bring transparency to their budget process, I will continue to veto legislation that is not in the best interest of all Mainers. I ask each one of you to stand up for the Maine people and support these vetoes.
