HOUSE.

Tuesday, Jan. 19, 1897.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Snyder of Augusta.

Papers from the Senate passed in concurrence.

An act to secure the secret ballot was in the Senate referred in nonconcurrence to the committee on legal affairs. The House receded from the vote by which it referred this act to the committee on the judiciary and concurred with the Senate in referring it to the committee on legal affairs.

JUDICIARY.

By Mr. Merrill of Portland—Bill an act giving notaries public jurisdiction throughout the State.

By Mr. Walton of Skowhegan—Bill an act to regulate steam engineering and to provide for the examination and licensing of engineers.

LEGAL AFFAIRS.

By Mr. Guernsey of Dover—Bill an act to create a lien on school timber and bars.

By Mr. Pierce of Frankport—Bill an act additional to and amendatory of an act entitled an act to incorporate the Winterport Ferry Company.

By Mr. Walton of Skowhegan—Bill an act to amend section 31 of chapter 83 of the Revised Statutes relating to unpaid executions issued by deceased trial justices.

By Mr. Durgin of Orono-Bill an act to incorporate the Orono Water Company.

FINANCIAL AFFAIRS.

By Mr. Moore of Deering—Petition of W. W. Mitchell and 30 others of Deering, in aid of the Little Samaritan Aid Society of Portland; petition of Joshua L. Chamberlain and 52 others for same.

EDUCATION.

By Mr. Sewall of Bath—Bill an act requiring all educational institutions receiving State aid to make reports and to account for receipts and expenditures to the trustees of the State normal schools on penalty of forfeiting such aid.

By Mr. Edmunds of Corinth—Resolve in favor of East Corinth Academy.

By Mr. Jones of Lincoln—Petition of trustees of Lee Normal Academy asking for appropriation for two years.

RAILROADS, TELEGRAPHS AND EXPRESSES.

By Mr. Rowell of Kittery—Bill an act to incorporate the Kittery and Eliot Street Railway company and to authorize the construction of the same across navigable tide waters.

By Mr. Currier of Farmington—Bill an act to incorporate the Franklin, Somerset and Kennebec Ry. Co.

BANKS AND BANKING.

By Mr. Maxcy of Gardiner—Bill an act to amend the charter of the Maine Trust and Banking Company.

INTERIOR WATERS.

By Mr. Floyd of Brewer—Petition of H. J. Leach and 88 others, citizens of Bangor and Brewer, asking for the passage of an act to regulate the length of rafts of logs which may be run or towed on the Penobscot river so as not to interfere with the regular passage of ferry boats between said cities; bill an act to prevent the unreasonable obstruction of public travel over the Penobscot river.

WAYS AND BRIDGES.

By Mr. Moore of Moscow—Resolve in favor of the town of Moscow to aid in support of the Babbit bridge road, with accompanying petition and statement of facts.

By Mr. Durgin of Orono—Bill an act additional to an act of 1865 to establish a ferry across the Penobscot river, as amended by the act of 1880.

INLAND FISHERIES AND GAME.

By Mr. Cushman of Andover—Petition of A. E. Herrick and 80 others of Bethel asking for an appropriation for warden service for Oxford county for the years 1897 and 1898.

By Mr. Penley of Greenwood—Petition of Jonathan Bartlett and 25 others for same; petition of D. E. Mills and 19 others of Albany for same; petition of J. H. Jewett and 38 others of Waterford for same; petition of Daniel

We, the citizens of Boothbay, petition that a law be passed allowing the citizens to fish with drag seines in Damariscotta river; petition of the people of Edgecomb to fish for smelts with drag seines in the Damariscotta river; petition of 54 citizens of Boothbay, Bristol and Edgecomb for same; petition of 24 citizens of Edgecomb for same; petition of 69 citizens of Boothbay for same; petition of 46 citizens of Bristol for same; petition of 88 citizens of Boothbay for same.

By Mr. Gowell of Berwick—Petition of S. B. Chick and 16 others, citizens of the town of Berwick, that the petition of George F. Stone and others may be granted.
