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SENATE.

Thursday, Jan. 21, 1897.

Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

, Prayer by Rev. Mr. Snyder of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Bill an act relating to repairs on highways in towns came from the House referred to the committee on highways and bridges. Upon motion by Mr. Merrill of Somerset, the bill was laid on the table pending reference.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and referred.

JUDICIARY.

By Mr. Savage of Androscoggin—Bill an act to amend section 1, chapter 121 of the Revised Statutes relating to forgery.

Bill an act to amend chapter 30 of the Public Laws of 1895 relating to liens on buildings.

Bill an act to amend section 1 of chapter 75 of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter 157 of the Public Laws of 1895 relating to title by descent.

By Mr. Grindle of Hancock—Petition of Ann F. Greeley and 182 others of Ellsworth, Hancock county, in favor of woman suffrage in municipal elections.

By Mr. Poor of Oxford—Bill an act relating to the Portland and Rumford Falls Railway, receiver of the Rumford Falls and Buckfield Railroad Company.

Petition of Mrs. O. M. Mason of Bethel and others, to raise the age of protection of girls from 14 to 18.

LEGAL AFFAIRS.

By Mr. Reynolds of Cumberland—Bill an act to change the name of the St. Lawrence Street Congregational parish, Portland.

Bill an act authorizing the construction of a wharf into tide waters of Casco bay and bridges over tide waters in the town of Harpswell.

RAILROADS, TELEGRAPHS AND EXPRESSES.

By Mr. Poor of Oxford—Bill an act relating to the Rumford Falls and Buckfield Railroad Company.

INLAND FISHERIES AND GAME.

By Mr. Chamberlain of Lincoln—Petition of Morrill Glidden and 39 others of Somerville, Lincoln county, asking for appropriation for sufficient warden service in Lincoln county for the years 1897 and 1898.

By Mr. Witham of Cumberland—Petition of D. W. Rounds, M. D. and 34 others of Naples, asking for sufficient appropriation for operation of Sebago Lake hatchery and for sufficient warden service in Cumberland county.

CLAIMS.

By Mr. Parsons of Piscataquis—Resolve in favor of the town of Monson.

READ AND ASSIGNED.

Senate document No. 5. Resolve in providing for State pensions for invalid soldiers and sailors, their widows and orphans, and the dependent children, parents and sisters of deceased soldiers and sailors eligible under existing laws.

Senate document No. 7. An act in relation to the bonds of trustees and guardians.
