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SENATE.

Tuesday, Feb. 16, 1897.

The Senate met according to adjourn-ment and was called to order by the president.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Quimby of Gardiner.

Journal of yesterday read and approved. Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Engel of Bangor, the Senate non-concurred with the House in its reference to the committee on legal affairs of the petition of Geo. F. Kimball and 56 others, in regard to the equaliza-tion of freight rates, and referred the same to the committee on railroads, telegraphs and expresses.

House resolve in favor of the town of Linneus came up on its first reading and on motion by Mr. Savage of Androscog-gin, was laid on the table pending first reading.
