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SENATE.

Wednesday, March 3, 1897.

The Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Williamson of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday read and approved. Papers from the House disposed of in CONCULTENCE

Bill, an act authorizing cities and towns to accept conveyances of burial lots in trust and to provide for recording of such conveyances.

This bill came from the House referred to the committee on legal affairs. Upon motion by Mr. Savage of Androscoggin, it was laid upon the table, Mr. Savage stating that a bill relating to the same subject matter is already upon its passage.

HOUSE BILLS READ AND ASSIGNED.

Company. Mr. Savage of Androscoggin, offered amendment A. Strike out the word "rail-road" at the end of the ninth line of section 2, and add to the end of section 2 the following: "Said company may lay and maintain pipes across any railroad, but in case of failure to agree with any railroad company as to place, manner and conditions of crossing its railroad with such pipes, the place, manner and conditions of such crossing shall be de-termined by the railroad commissioners, termined by the railroad commissioners, and all work within the limits of the railroad location shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officers of the railroad company, but at the expense of said water company." As such ac-tion will undoubtedly be a contravention of the provisions of the constitution, I called it to the attention of parties who are interested in the case, and they have agreed upon the following amendment agreed upon the following amendment, which I offer: "Amendment A. Amend section 1 as

follows:

tollows: "1-Strike out the words ' "Piscataquis" in the 20th line,' in lines 11 and 12, and in-sert in lieu thereof the words 'manufact-ure in the 15th line.' "2-Insert after the word 'following' in line 12 the words, 'Said lien may be en-forced in the mark be en-

forced in the manner provided in sections 38 and 39, of chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes, for enforcing liens on logs and lumber.

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"3-Strike out all after the word 'manu-facture' in line 31, to and including the word 'Piscataquis' in line 36, and insert in lieu thereof the words, 'Said lieu may he enforced in the manner provided in sections 38 and 39, of chapter 91, of the Revised Statutes, for enforcing liens on logs and lumber.' "

Amendment adopted, bill read the sec-ond time as amended and passed to be engrossed.

engrossed. On motion by Mr. Grindle of Hancock, bill an act to incorporate the town of Swan's Island, was taken from the table. Mr. Grindle: I have an amendment which I wish to offer. The substance of it simply gives the voters of Swan's Island the privilege of voting upon the question and of deciding whether they will be incorporated or not, by a vote at any time within two years. It seems to me a very reasonable request that they make, and I hope the amendment will be accepted and the bill passed as amended. "Amendment A. Amena section 5 by

"Amendment A. Amena section 5 by adding at the end thereof the following words: 'By a majority vote of the duly qualified voters of Swan's Island plantation, at a meeting duly called therefor, at any time within two years from the date of the approval of this act by the Coverner'?" Governor.
