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## SENATE.

Tuesday, Jan. 31, 1899.

On motion by Mr. Vickery of Kennebec, the report of the committee on public buildings with accompanying order assigning room to the secretary of the Senate, was taken from the table.

On motion by Mr. Blanchard of Franklin, the communication of the Executive transmitting report of commissioners appointed to investigate and ascertain as to the desirability of establishing new Normal schools in eastern or central Maine, tabled for printing, was taken from the table and referred to the committee on education.

On motion by Mr. Adams of Penobscot, an act to amend Section 1, of Chapter 350 of the Private and Special Laws of 1897, relating to the erection and maintenance of booms in the Penobscot river, tabled pending first reading, was taken from the table, read once and tomorrow assigned.
