HOUSE BILLS READ AND ASSIGNED.

Bill an act to amend section 1 of chapter 436 of the Special Laws of 1834, entitled "An act to incorporate the city of Bangor, approved February 12, 1834."

Resolve to enable the county of Aroostook to refund its debt.

Bill an act to amend chapter 207 of the Private and Special Laws of 1895, as amended by chapter 344 of the Private and Special Laws of 1897, relating to the Rockland and Vinalhaven Telegraph and Telephone Company.

Bill an act for the better protection of deer in the counties of Cumberland, York and Sagadanoc.

Bill an act to armend section 2 of chapter 96 of the laws of the year 1887, providing for the extension of railroads.

Bill an act to amend section 4 of chap-

ter 71 of the R. S., relating to licenses to sell real estate.

Bill an act to amend chapter 154 of the Private and Special Laws of 1895 relating to the charter of the Wiscasset Water Co.

Bill an act to prevent the wearing of spiked boots or shoes in public places.

Bill an act to amend section 6 of chapter 156 of the Public Laws of 1895 entitled, "An act to amend section 6 of chapter 35 of the R. S., relating to intelligence offices."

Bill an act to incorporate the Brownville Water Co.

PASSED TO BE ENACTED.

An act amendatory of and additional to chapter 458 of the Private and Special Laws of 1897, entitled "An act to incorporate the Northern Development Company."

An act to amend section 1 of chapter 350 of the Private and Special Laws of 1897, relating to the erection and maintenance of booms in the Penobscoi river.

Resolve in favor of the roads in the In-. dian township, Washington county.

Resolve in favor of Thomas Bailey, representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

On motion by Mr. Stearns of Aroostook, bill an act in relation to increase of salary of justices of the supreme judicial court, specially assigned for Wednesday, was taken from the table and reassigned for Thursday, Feb. 9.

Mr. Merrill of Somerset, submitted report of the committee on financial affairs, to which was referred the report of the State treasurer, also the report of the commission appointed to audit the accounts of the State treasurer, and that the Legislature proceed to the election of State treasurer.

The report was accepted and Mr. Merrill presented the following order:

Ordered, the House concurring that the members of the Legislature convene forthwith in the hall of the House of Representatives in joint convention for the purpose of electing a State treasurer for the years 1899 and 1900.

The order was passed and the president directed the secretary to convey a message to the House proposing a joint convention for the election of State treasurer. The secretary proceeded to the hall of Representatives and subsequently announced that he had delivered the message with which he was charged.

A message was received from the House, by its clerk, announcing the concurrence of that branch in the proposition for a joint convention.

The session of the Senate was then suspended and the Senate proceeded to the hall of the House of Representatives.
