SENATE.

Tuesday, March 7, 1899.

The Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Crosby of Augusta.

Journal of Friday read and approved. Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Bill an act to amend section 2, of chapter 115, of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 264, of the Public Laws of 1893, relating to the salary of the county attorney of Cumberland county.

This bill came up on its first reading, and on motion by Mr. Witham of Cumberland, was laid on the table pending second reading.

HOUSE BILLS READ AND ASSIGNED.

Bill an act to amend section 1, of chapter 6, of the Revised Statutes, relating to poll taxes, by adding to said section the words, "which said poll tax shall not exceed three dollars and shall not be less than one dollar."

Bill an act providing for the appointment and compensation of the recorder of the municipal court of the city of Saco.

Bill an act to create a lien upon hay, for the cutting and pressing thereof.

Bill an act to amend the title of chapter 295, of the Public Laws of 1897.

Bill an act to extend the rights, powers and privileges of the Eastport Street Railway.

Bill an act to extend the time for the construction of the Boothbay Railroad.

Bill an act in relation to corporations issuing contracts for annuities commencing in the future.

Bill an act authorizing the Manufacturers Trust Company to establish a branch at Old Orchard.

Bill an act to amend section 6, of chapter 562, of the Private and Special Laws of 1868, said chapter being entitiled, "An act to incorporate the Buxton and Hollis Savings Bank."

Resolve authorizing a change in the location of a right of way to State lands in Augusta.

Resolve in favor of improving the sanitary condition of the State camp ground.

Bill an act to incorporate the State birds, wild animals and county taxes for the years 1899 and the State of Maine.

An act amendatory of and additional to chapter 18, of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 329, of the Public Laws of 1897, relating to the repair of highways.

An act amendatory to chapter 287, of the Public Laws of 1893, relating to the protection of sheep.

An act to increase the salary of the county attorney of Sagadahoc county.

An act to establish a salary for the clerk of the judicial court's of Washington county.

An act to enable the commissioners of inland fisheries and game to increase the State museum, consisting of mounted specimens and pictures of birds, wild animals and fish native to the State of Maine. An act to amend section 1, of chapter 115, of the Revised Statutes, relating to salaries of public officers.

An act giving a lien for shoring and running logs.

An act for the prevention of certain kinds of nuisances.

Bill an act to incorporate the Patten, Allegash & Northern Railroad Company.

Bill an act to amend Chapter 285 of the Public Laws of 1897, relating to sea and shore fisheries.

Bill an act relating to the jurisdiction of municipal and police courts.

Resolve in favor of the commissioners appointed by the Governor to inquire into and report upon the advisability of establishing State Normal schools.

Bill an act to amend Chapter 407 of the Private and Special Laws of 1889, entitled "An act to incorporate the trustees of Van Buren College, and to authorize the faculty of said college to confer degrees."

Bill an act to extend the charter of the Ellsworth Street Railway.

Bill an act to amend the charter of the Waldo Street Railway.

Bill an act to amend the charter of the Augusta Safe Deposit and Trust Company.

Bill an act to extend the charter of the Bluehill Trust and Banking Company.

Bill an act to revive and amend Chapter 276 of the Private and Special Laws of 1895, entitled "An act to incorporate the Van Buren Trust and Banking Company."

Mr. Plummer for the committee on legal affairs reported ought to pass bill an act to amend Section 8 of Chapter 60 of the Revised Statutes regulating the right of trial by jury in divorce suits.

Mr. Reynolds for the same committee reported ought to pass bill an act to amend Section 8 of Chapter 64 and Section 4 of Chapter 71 of the Revised Statutes relating to sales of real estate by license of court.

The reports were accepted and the bills laid on the table for printing under rule.

Bill an act to extend the charter of the Bluehill Water Company.

Bill an act to incorporate the Lily Water Company.

Bill an act authorizing the trustees of the ministerial fund in the Congregational Society in Buxton to apply the interest of said fund toward the payment of the minister's salary.

But an act to extend and amend the charter of the Castine Railway Navigation Company.

Senate amendment "A" to this bill was adopted.

The foregoing bills were read the third time and passed to be engrossed under suspension of the rules on motion by Mr. Philbrook of Waterville.

Bill an act to fix the salaries of the judge and register of probate for the county of Waldo.

Read the third time and passed to be engrossed under suspension of the rules on motion by Mr. Hill of Belfast.

Bill an act for the better protection of clams.

Senate amendment "A," to this bill was adopted. The bill was then read the third time and passed to be engrossed as amended under suspension of the rules on motion by Mr. Philbrook of Waterville.

Bill an act for the better protection of ship masters and seamen.

Read the third time and passed to be engrossed under suspension of the rules on motion by Mr. Chase of Portland,

Bill an act to repeal chapter 280, of the Private and Special Laws of 1883, relating to the use of rafts or floats in fishing for smelts in Bagaduce river.
