HOUSE.

Tuesday, Jan. 27.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Cudworth of Augusta.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

Bill, An Act establishingg the salary of the county attorney for the county of Kennebec, came from the Senate referred to the Kennebec county delegation.

On motion of Mr. Dudley of Augusta, the bill was laid on the table pending its reference in concurrence.

The following petitions, bills, etc., were presented and referred:

Judiciary.

By Mr. Putnam of Houlton: Bill, An Act to incorporate the F. R. Wilson Taxidermy and Fur Company of Houlton.

Legal Affairs.

By Mr. Clark of Nobleboro: Remonstrance of H. Elizabeth Webb and 98 other women of Damariscotta and Newcastle against the enactment of any legislation conferring suffrage upon women.

Education.

By Mr. Thornton of Ashland: Petition of C. C. Libby of Oxbow Plantation and 11 others in favor of a normal school in Aroostook county, to be located at Presque Isle.

Banks and Banking.

By Mr. Davis of Waterville: Bill, An Act to authorize savings banks to invest in municipal bonds.

Inland Fisheries and Game.

By Mr. Smith of Hartland: Bill, An Act to prohibit fishing in Morrill pond in the county of Somerset.

Also: Bill, An Act to provide for fishing in Goodwin brook in the towns of St. Albans and Hartland.

Claims.

By Mr. Putnam of Houlton: Resolve in favor of the town of Houlton.

Temperance.

By Mr. Bailey of Bradford. Remonstrance of the members of the Baptist church of Kenduskeag against resubmission.

Also: Remonstrance of Rev. H. B. Mory and 21 others of Kenduskeag against resubmission.

By Mr. Hill of Brownfield: Remonstrance of Fannie M. J. Clifford and 20 others of the town of Hiram against resubmission.

Orders.

On motion of Mr. Dudley of Augusta, Ordered, That the use of this hall be tendered to the Maine Federation of Women's Clubs, Wednesday evening, January 28th.

On motion of Mr. Smith of Presque Isle,

Ordered, That when the House adjourns it adjourn to meet, Wednesday, January 28, 1903, at 9.30 o'clock.

First Reading of Printed Bills and Resolves.

An Act to amend Sections 1 and 4 of Chapter 339 of the Private and Special Laws of 1901, being an act to incorporate the Winthrop Cold Spring Water Company.

An Act to authorize the Old Orchard Light Company to issue bonds and for other purposes.

An Act to amend Section 28 of Chapter 73 of the Revised Statutes relating to conveyances.

Orders of the Day.

Mr. Davis of Waterville, moved a suspension of the rules to introduce a bill out of order.

The motion was agreed to.

Mr. Davis then moved that the bill, An Act relating to electric posts and wires, be referred to the committee on railroads, telegraphs and expresses.

On motion of Mr. Weeks of Fairfield, the bill was tabled for printing pending reference to the committee.

On motion of Mr. Thornton of Ashland, Bill, An Act to maintain large bridges by the county and State, was taken from the table, and on further motion by the same gentleman it was referred to the committee on ways and bridges.
