Mr. Newcomb of Eastport announced the attendance of Mr. Johnson, representative-elect from Calais, and was changed with the duty of conducting him before the Governor and Council to take the necessary oath of office.

Subsequently Mr. Newcomb reported that he had discharged the duty assigned him, and thereupon Mr. Johnson appeared and took his seat.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

Two petitions which came from the Senate in regard to the preservation of fields and forests, referred in that body to the committee on State lands and State roads, were tabled on motion of Mr. Sewall of Bath, pending their reference by the House in concurrence.

The following petitions, bills, etc., were presented and referred:

#### Judiciary.

By Mr. Baldwin of Boothbay Harbor: Petition of Jason C. McKown and 121 others for the repeal of chapter 443 of the private and special laws of 1901.

By Mr. Milliken of Island Falls: Bill, an act to incorporate the Island Falls Water Company.

By Mr. Hale of Portland: Bill, an act relating to appointment of constables by city council of Portland.

By Mr. Gannett of Augusta: Bill, an act to authorize the Augusta Water District to acquire the property and franchises of the Devine Water Company.

By Mr. Poor of Belfast: Bill, an act to amend section 6 of chapter 65 of the Revised Statutes relating to probate courts.

By Mr. Seavey of Bridgton: Bill, an act to permit the Bridgton Street Railway Company to discontinue the operation of its line during certain months in the year.

By Mr. Morey of Lewiston: Bill, an act to amend section 2 of chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes relating to interest on loans on personal property.

#### Legal Affairs.

By Mr. Tupper of Bangor: Petition of Mrs. Alice H. Gould and 28 others of Bangor to preserve the beauty of fields and forests by preventing advertising signs.

By Mr. Baxter of Portland: Petition of Agnes E. Chase and seven others, members of the Women's Clubs of Maine, for the enactment of laws to preserve the beauty of the fields and forests of Maine by preventing them from being defaced by advertising signs, and for the preservation of the forests and the planting of trees along the highways of the State.

By Mr. Reed of Portland: Bill, an act to incorporate the Shore Acres Water Company.

By Mr. Kinsman of Cornville: Bill, an act to regulate the practice of verterinary surgery, medicine and dentistry.

#### Banks and Banking.

By Mr. Knapp of South Portland: Bill, an act to extend the charter of the South Portland Trust and Banking Company.

By Mr. Oakes of Auburn: Bill, an act to amend section 79 of chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes relating to the authority of bank examiner over trust and banking companies.

#### Agriculture.

By Mr. Hale of Portland: Petition to enact laws to preserve fields and forests of Maine by Marion Dow Eaton and 13 others.

By Mr. Howes of Palmyra: Petition of Sadie E. Mayo and 16 others relating to fields and forests.

#### Interior Waters.
