HOUSE.

Wednesday, Jan. 18, 1905.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Plummer of Hallowell

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

Bill, an act to regulate the practice of veterinary surgery, medicine and dentistry, referred in the House to the committee on legal affairs, comes from the Senate that body non-concurring with the House in its reference, and referring the bill to the committee on agriculture.

On motion of Mr. Kinsman of Cornville the House receded and concurred with the Senate in its reference.

Orders of the Day.

On motion of Mr. Merrill of Skow-Bill, an act to amend Section 25 of Chapter 8 of the Revised Statutes relating to the taxation of railroad companies, was taken from the table and on further motion by the same gentlemen it was referred to the committee on taxation.

A message was received from the Senate through its secretary proposing a joint convention of the two branches of the Legislature at 12 o'clock, meridian, on this 18th day of January in the hall of the House, for the purpose of reading the journal of each branch of the Legislature relating to the vote for a Senator in Congress for the term beginning on the fourth day of March next, and for such other proceedings in relation to the matter of the election of such Senator in Congress as are the constitution required by statutes of the United States.

ORDERED, That Hon. Eugene Hale of Ellsworth be and hereby is declared duly elected Senator in Congress for the term of six years, beginning on the fourth of March, A. D. 1905; and further ordered that the secretary of the convention forthwith inform the Governor of the election and declaration thereof by the Legislature of Hon. Eugene Hale of Ellsworth as Senator in the

Congress of the United States for the term of six years beginning on the fourth of March, A. D. 1905.

The order received a passage.

PRESIDENT: And I declare Eugene Hale of Ellsworth elected to the Senate of the United States from the State of Maine for the term of six years beginning March 4, 1905, (applause), and the secretary of the convention will convey the information to the Governor.

The secretary subsequently reported that he had performed the duty assigned him.

The Senate then retired.

In House.

On motion of Mr. Sewall the rules were suspended and that gentleman presented the fellowing order:

ORDERED, The Senate concurring, that the joint select committee on State printing be and hereby is authorized to employ a stenographer and to summon witnesses to appear and produce books and papers and other documents and give evidence pertaining to the inquiry with which the committee is charged.

The order received a passage. On motion of Mr. Walker, of Lovell, Adjourned.
