Monday, Feb. 13, 1905.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Clark of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

Senate Bills on First Reading.

Resolve in favor of Frank T. Pennel. An Act to extend the charter of the Maine Water and Electric Power Company.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Smith of Appleton, Knox county.

Resolve in favor of the King's Daughters' Home, Bangor, Maine.

Resolve in favor of John Chadwick & Co. to aid navigation in Mooselucmaguntic lake.

Resolve to complete the improvements of Songo river and to establish and maintain buoys in Long and Sebago lakes in Cumberland county.

Bil, An Act to incorporate the Houlton Trust Co. came from the Senate amended by Senate amendment A. In the House the amendment was adopted and the bill passed to be engrossed as amended.

Petition of G. B. Noyes and 19 others of Charleston in favor of Maine State Sanitarium Association, referred in the House to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs, comes from the Senate placed on file in non-concurrence.

The House receded and concurred with the Senate in its action.

Mr. KIMBALL of Rockland: Mr. Speaker, any member of the House who has ever had occasion to examine bills or any documents that were in the hands of any documents that were in the hands of a committee over adjournment, knows the difficulty which he has in doing so, and it 'vould seem as though some ar-rangement might be made whereby, if it is necessary for the secretaries or clerks to be absent over adjournment, those pa-pers could be deposited where they would be easy of access; and I therefore move the adoption of the following order: Ordered, That the committee on rules and business of the House make suitable arrangements so that all papers and doc-

arrangements so that all papers and doc-uments in the hands of secretaries or clerks of committees may be accessible on each secular day.

The order received a passage Mr. OAKES of Auburn: M

Mr Speaker, by desire of the committee on rules of the Horse I will call attention to rule 46 in regard to placing petitions, memo-rials and papers in the box before 5 o'clock of each day, and in regard to the violation of this rule which, for motives of convenience and not necessary very often, occurs by reason of members asking for unanimous consent to introduce various matters out of order. Of course occasionally it is necessary that such a thing should be introduced out of order; but it is the belief of the committee that a compliance of the House with the rule would facilitate business in every way. And while the committee do not wish to interpose objections unnecessarily, they hope that every member of the House will, if possible, avoid asking unanimous consent to introduce measures out of orconsent to introduce measures out of or-der. Most of these things can just as well wait until the next day and go in in their regular order. The great difficulty comes in keeping track of the business of the House when many things are introduced in this manner.
