**SENATE.**

Thursday, February 23, 1905.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Fr. Hamel of Augusta.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

"Petition of Alfred S. Dunning and 14 others of Harpswell for the repeal of section 25 of chapter 9 of the new Revision of the Statutes relating to manufacturing, mining and smelting corporations," came from the House referred to the committee on legal affairs. On motion by Mr. Clark of Hancock, the Senate non-concurred with the House in such reference, and on further motion by the same Senator, the petition was referred to the committee on taxation.

On motion by Mr. Tupper of Lincoln, bill, "An act authorizing the codification of the sea and shore fisheries laws," which came from the House referred in that branch of the committee on shore fisheries was tabled.

**House Resolve Read and Assigned.**

Resolve in favor of Penobscot tribe of Indians for the year 1905.

The following resolves came from the House, having been reported by the committee on claims, "ought to pass," said report having been accepted by that branch, namely:

Resolve in favor of Jackman Plantation.

Resolve in favor of Moose River Plantation.

On motion by Mr. Putnam of Aroostook the foregoing resolves were severally tabled.

Mr. Tartre of York, introduced under suspension of the rules, bill "An act relating to the York Light and Heat Company," and on further motion by the same Senator, the same was referred to the committee on legal affairs.

An act to extend the charter of the Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

**Reports of Committees.**

Mr. Simpson, for the committee on sea and shore fisheries, on report of the commissioner on sea and shore fisheries for the year 1904, reported that no legislation is necessary. Report accepted.

Mr. Futnam, for the committee on appropriations and financial affairs, on "Resolve in favor of the Waldo County General Hospital," reported same in new draft under same title and that it ought to pass. Report accepted.

Mr. Tupper, for the committee on sea and shore fisheries, on bill, "An act authorizing the West Harbor Ice Company to construct a fish way and to protect alewives in West Harbor Ice Pond and its tributaries," reported same ought to pass. Report accepted.

**Passed to be Engrossed.**

An act to amend chapter 86 of the private and special laws of 1903, entitled "An act to authorize the Orono Pulp and Paper Company to generate, sell and use electricity."

An act to extend the charter of the Mattanawcook Manufacturing Company.

An act to extend the time in which the Van Puren Sewerage Company is authorized to commence business.

An act additional to chapter 49 of the Revised Statutes, defining fraternal beneficiary associations doing business in 1889.

An act relating to the Pine Grove Cemetery of Falmouth, Maine.

An act to incorporate the Stockton Springs Water Company.

Resolve in favor of Maine Children's Home Society.

Resolve in favor of Peter F. Neptune, Representative of Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

An act to authorize the European and North American Railway, and the Maine Central Railroad Company, its lessee, to change the location of its railroad bridge across the Kenduskeag stream, in Bangor.

An act to extend the charter of the Eastport Street Railway Company.

An act to extend the charter of the Wilton Trust Company.

An act to continue in force the charter of the Van Buren Trust Company.

An act to extend the charter of the Cumberland Trust Company.

An act to provide for the protection of trees and shrubs from the introduction of ravages of dangerous insects and diseases.

Resolve providing for preventing contagious diseases among cattle and horses.

Resolve in favor of Maine State Poultry and Pet Stock Association.

An act to authorize James Crawford and his associates to erect and maintain piers and booms in the St. John river in the town of Grand Isle.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to sell certain public lots in Wallagrass and Eagle Lake plantations.

An act to regulate fishing in Shadow pond so called in Squaw Mountain township, county of Piscataquis.

An act to amend section 44 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes relating to close time on smelts.

Resolve making an appropriation for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

An act to authorize the county commissioners of Aroostook county to create a sinking fund for the purpose of paying the bonded debt of said county.

An act to amend section 13 of chapter 128 of the Revised Statutes relating to malicious mischief.

An act providing for an epidemic or emergency fund.

An act to amend section eleven of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, relating to the close time on beaver.

An act repealing chapter four hundred and forty-three of the private and special laws of the year nineteen hundred and one, relating to the annual town meeting of Boothbay Harbor.

An act to preserve the purity of the source of water supply for the villages of Livermore Falls and Chisholm and to protect the public health.

An act in relation to the original plans of towns in Kennebec county.

An act to extend the charter of the Phillips Trust Company.

Resolve in favor of Bates College.  
Resolve in favor of the town of Pittston.

Resolve in favor of Fred W. Lee, Augusta, Maine.

Resolve in favor of the Madawaska Training School.

Resolve in favor of roads in the Indian township, Washington county.

Resolve in favor of the Deaconess Home Association of Bangor.

Resolve in favor of aid building a highway bridge across the Sebasticook river in the town of Benton.

#### Orders of the Day.

On motion by Mr. Tupper of Lincoln, bill, "an act authorizing the codification of sea and shore fisheries laws," was taken from the table. On further motion by the same senator, the same was referred to the committee on sea and shore fisheries.

On motion by Mr. Simpson of York, bill, "an act to incorporate the Prouts Neck Village corporation," was taken from the table. On further motion by the same senator, the same was referred to the committee on judiciary.

On motion by Mr. Morse of Waldo, Table Document No. 11, "Report of the committee on inland fisheries and game referred to commissioners of inland fisheries and game, on bill to close Marsh river in Waldo county," was taken from the table. On further motion by the same senator, the report was accepted.

On motion by Mr. Philoon of Androscoggin, House document No. 145 bill, to amend the charter of the city of Auburn, with accompanying report of committee on legal affairs, ought to pass was taken from the table. On further motion by the same senator, the report of the committee was accepted. On further motion by the same senator the rules were suspended, the bill took its two several readings, and was passed to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Philoon of Androscoggin the Senate adjourned to meet on Friday, February 24, 1905, at ten o'clock in the forenoon.
