SENATE.

Wednesday, March 8, 1911. Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Evans of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following Bills, Petitions, etc., were presented and referred:

By Mr. Leach of Hancock-Petition of 37 residents of Orland to abolish the office of recorder of the Western Hancock Municipal Court.

Also, Petition of 164 residents of Hancock county for same.

By Mr. Hill of Penobscot-Bill, An Act amendatory of Chapter 60 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 95 of the Public Laws of 1909, relating to Agricultural Societies.

An Act to incorporate the Carleton Stream Dam Company came from the Senate amended by Senate Amendments A and B..
