SENATE.

Tuesday, January 7, 1913. Senate call¢d to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. William F. Livingston of Hallowell.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and referred:

Judiciary.

By Mr. Hersey of Aroostook: Bill, An Act to amend Section 10 of Chapter 6 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter 135 of the Public Laws of 1905, and to amend Section 24 of said Chapter 6 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the regulation and conduct of elections. (Tabled for printing pending reference on motion of Mr. Hersey).

By Mr. Dutton of Kennebec: Resolve, ratifying an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, providing that the United States senators shall be elected by the people of he several states. (Tabled for printing pending reference on motion of Mr. Dutton).

On motion by Mr. Emery of York, that senator presented the bond of Joseph W. Simpson, State treasurer.

On further motion by the same senator, the bond was referred to the committee on appropriation and financial affairs.

On motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook, it was Ordered: The House concurring, that a list of the committees of this Legislature, together with the order of proceedings and rules of each branch, and the joint rules be printed in pamphlet form, three hundred copies, for the use of the Senate, and seven hundred and fifty for the use of the House.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Emery of York, it was

Ordered, That the secretary of the Senate be authorized to furnish wrappers and postage stamps to each member and officer of the Senate. not to exceed five dollars in amount each, for the purpose of distributing the various reports of the departments of State, and other public documents such as they may desire to mail to the citizens of the State.

On motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook, it was

Ordered: That the Maine Bar Association have the use of the Senate Chamber for its annual meeting, Wednesday, Jan. 8, 1913, at 2 P. M.

On motion by Mr. Morey of Androscoggin, Bill, An Act to permit local option in taxation, tabled by him for printing was taken from the table, and upon further motion by the same senator the bill was referred to the committee on taxation and sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Moulton of Cumberland, adjourned until tomorrow morning, at 10 o'clock.
