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SENATE.

Friday, January 31, 1913. Senate called to order by the President

Prayer by Rev. Robert S. Pinkham of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Stearns of Oxford, unanimous consent was given, and he introduced the following order out of order and moved its passage:

when the Senate and House adjourn, it be to meet Monday afternoon, February 3, at 4.30 o'clock.

Passed and sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the order was returned from the House, that Branch having concurred in its passage.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

An Act to create the Oakland Water Company, came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on judiciary, and on motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook, was tabled for printing pending reference, in concurrence.

An Act relating to Squirrel Island Village Corporation, came from the House by that Branch referred to the the committee on judiciary, and on moby Mr. Boynton of Lincoln, was tabled for printing pending reference in concurrence.

An Act to prevent evasion of payment of telephone charges, came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on judiciary, and on motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook was tabled for printing pending reference in concurrence.

An Act to extend the charter of the Lubec, East Machias and Machias Railway Company, came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on judiciary, and on motion by Mr. Cole of York, was tabled pending reference in concurrence.

An Act to set off Capitol Island and Squirrel Island from the town of resolution.

Southport, came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on judiciary, and on motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook, was tabled pending reference in concurrence.

An Act to authorize the Calais Street Railway to sell electricity, came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on legal affairs, and on motion by Mr. Bailey of Penobscot, was tabled for printing pending reference in concurrence.

Resolve for an amendment to the Ordered: The House concurring, that Constitution providing for the proposal of amendment by initiative petition. came from the House by that Branch referred to the committee on legal affairs, and on motion by Mr. Hersey of Aroostook, was tabled for printing pending reference in concurrence.

"STATE OF MAINE.

January 30th, 1913.

Whereas, there has been introduced into Congress a bill known as the Mc-Lean Bill, Senate Document No. 6497, to afford federal protection to migratory game and insectivorous birds, and whereas, there is a general sentiment in favor of such protection, and an urgent reguest for the enactment of such a law has been made, now, therefore.

Resolved, that Congress be and is hereby requested to enact a law, giving ample protection to migratory game and insectivorous birds.

Resolved, that the Legislatures of all other states of the United States, now in session or when next convened, be and they hereby are respectfully requested, to join in this request by the adoption of this, or any equivalent

Resolved, further, that the secretary of State be and hereby is directed to transmit copies of this resolution to the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, and to the several members of said body representing this State therein, also to transmit copies hereof to the Legislature of all other states of the United States.'

On motion by Mr. Stearns of Oxford, the resolution was tabled pending its passage in concurrence.
