SENATE.

Monday, March 10, 1913. Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Robert S. Pinkham of Gardiner,

Journal of previous session read and approved.

From the House: Senate Document 99, An Act to amend Sections 5 and 6 of Chapter 15 of the Public Laws of 1907, as amended by Chapter 34 of the Public Laws of 1909, and Chapters 84 and 176 of the Public Laws of 1911, relating to the protection of trees and shrubs from dangerous insects and diseases.

In the Senate this bill was read twice and passed to be engrossed. In the House the bill was read three times and passed to be engrossed. Subsequently in the House the vote whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed was reconsidered and the bill recommitted to the committee on agriculture.

The Senate reconsidered the vote whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed, and the bill was then recommitted to the committee on agriculture in concurrence.

From the House: An Act additional to and amendatory of Chapter 133 of the Private and Special Laws of the year 1909, as amended by Chapter 272 of the Private and Special Laws of 1911, and to repeal Chapter 420 of the Private and Special Laws of 1903, and Chapter 23 of the Private and Special Laws of 1907 in regard to the use of automobiles on the Island of Mount Desert.

In the House the report of the judiciary committee, "ought to pass in a new draft" under the title of "An Act permitting the use of automobiles in the town of Eden," was accepted in concurrence. Pending third reading House Amendment A was adopted.

In the Senate on motion by Mr. Stearns of Oxford, the bill and amendment were tabled pending acceptance of the amendment in concurrence, and next Wednesday assigned for its consideration.
