SENATE.

Saturday, March 29, 1913.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Benjamin P. Hope of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Mr. STEARNS of Oxford: Mr. President, I desire to introduce an order at this time, out of order, in relation to adjournment and move its passage.

There was no objection, and the senator presented the following order, which was passed:

Ordered, that when the Senate adjourn, it adjourn to meet Monday, March 31, at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon.

A communication was received from the office of secretary of State, transmitting report of the trustees and principle of the Maine School for the Deaf at Portland, for the year ending December 31, 1912.

The following resolves were presented and referred:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Emery of York: Resolve in favor of the clerk, stenographer and messenger to the committee on appropriations and financial affairs.

By Mr. Morey of Androscoggin: Resolve in favor of M. S. Hill, clerk to the committee on taxation.

Senate Bills in First Reading.

An Act to provide for appointment of road commissioners by selectmen.

An Act to provide for temporary clerk hire for municipal court of the city of Lewiston.

An Act to provide for temporary clerk hire for the clerk of courts in York county.

An Act to provide for temporary clerk hire for the register of probate in Aroostook county.

Resolve in favor of Mary H. Perkins for services as stenographer to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House and for clerical assistance in the office of the secretary of the Senate.

An Act to amend Chapter 193 of the

Public Laws of 1909, creating the Maine Forestry District and providing for protection against forest fires therein.

An Act to amend Chapter 117 of the Public Laws of 1905, relating to compensation of county commissioners.

Orders of the Day.

An Act to amend Section 5 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes relating to the salary of officers to attend superior court, Cumberland.

On motion by Mr. Stearns of Oxford, the vote was reconsidered whereby this bill was tabled and assigned for Monday afternoon.

The motion was agreed to.

On further motion by the same senator, the bill was given its second reading and was passed to be engrossed.

Mr. DUTTON of Kennebec: Mr. President, if it would be proper for me to do so, I move to reconsider the vote whereby we assigned, yesterday, Senate Document, 550, an Act to incorporate the Kingman Telephone Company, for consideration next Monday afternoon.

The motion was agreed to.

The pending question being the acceptance of the report of the committee, on motion by the same senator, the report of the committee, "ought to pass in new draft" was accepted in concurrence.

The PRESIDENT: The pending question is upon the adoption of House Amendment A.

Mr. DUTTON: I move that we concur with the House in the adoption of House Amendment A.

The motion was agreed to, and the bill, as amended was given its first reading, and the second reading was assigned for Monday afternoon.

On motion by Mr. Richardson of Penobscot, the vote whereby House Document 630, An Act to permit the town of Pittsfield to obtain a pure water supply, was tabled and assigned for next Tuesday morning, was reconsidered.

On further motion by the same senator, the bill was given its second reading and was passed to be engrossed.
