SENATE

Tuesday, January 12, 1915.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. John Evans of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

The hour having arrived to which the joint convention adjourned, the Senate proceeded to the hall of the House.

On return of the Senate to its chamber, the Senate was called to order by the President.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair feels it is absolutely necessary at this time that the list of joint committees should be announced in the Senate, as they will be in the House, and without objection the secretary will read the list of joint committees.

The secretary thereupon read the list.

Afternoon Session

Senate called to order by the President at 3 o'clock, as per adjournment.

The hour having arrived to which the joint convention took a recess, the Senate proceeded to the hall of the House of Representatives.

Mr. Murphy of Cumberland, by unanimous consent, presented the following

committee report, out of order, and the same was read by the secretary:

STATE OF MAINE.

The joint committee, consisting of Messrs. Murphy of Cumberland and Cole of York on the part of the Senate, and Messrs. Gallagher of Bangor, Haskell of Portland and Waterhouse of Kennebec on the part of the House, who were authorized to make a contract with the New England Telephone & Telegraph Company for telephone service for the members of the 77th Legislature for matters connected with their official duties, beg leave to report that they have made an agreement with the New England Telephone & Telegraph Company whereby for the sum of \$500 the members of the 77th Legislature may, upon identification, for matters connected with their official duties use from the public attended pay station in the State House the lines of the company to points within the State during the present session of the Legislature.
