Friday, January 22, 1915.

Senate called to order by the President.
Prayer by Rev. Henry C. Wright of Gardiner.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Thurston of Oxford, it was

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

The following bills, petitions, etc., were presented and, on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills, were referred to the following committees:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

By Mr. Emery of York: Bill, An Act to appropriate moneys for the payment of salaries fixed by law for the year one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

By the same Senator: Resolve providing for co-operative work with the United States Geological Survey.

By Mr. Swift of Kennebec: Resolve in favor of Claud Willis Townsend, Jr., as-

sistant folder for the Senate of the 76th Legislature, for attendance at the organization of the 77th Legislature.

Salaries and Fees.

By Mr. Durgin of Piscataquis: Bill, An Act to equalize the salaries of registers of deeds.

By Mr. Conant of Waldo: Bill, An Act to equalize the salaries of sheriffs.

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Durgin of Piscataquis: Resolve in favor of a bridge across the easterly part of the west channel of the Sebec River in the town of Milo, county of Piscataquis.

By Mr. Colby of Somerset: Resolve in favor of building a state road from Jackman in Somerset County to Rockwood on Moosehead Lake.

By Mr. Boynton of Lincoln: Resolve appropriating money to complete the replanking of the bridge at Wiscasset.

On motion by Mr. Boynton of Lincoln, it was

Ordered: the House concurring, that the committee on Salaries and Fees be and hereby are authorized to employ an attorney to formulate bills to carry into effect the recommendations of the committee on Salaries and Fees of the 76th Legislature, at an expense not exceeding three hundred dollars.

Sent down for concurrence.
