SENATE

Friday, January 17, 1919.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. W. J. Layton of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

On motion by Mr. Metcalf of Piscataquis, under suspension of the rules, it was

Ordered, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn they adjourn to met next Tuesday, Jan. 21 1919, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

Sent down for concurrence.

Subsequently the Chair announced that the House had concurred in the passage of the order.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: An Act to amend Sections 53, 54 and 55 of Chapter 8 of the Revised Statutes requiring a permit for the burning of brush or slash near woodlands and providing for better enforcement of the slash law.

In the House this bill was referred to the committee on State lands and forest preservation.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Emerson of Aroostok, tabled and 500 copies ordered printed.

From the House: Ordered, the Senate concurring that the time for the reception of bills for private and special legislation be limited to Friday, January 31, 1919, and that all such petitions and bills presented after that day be referred to the next Legislature; that the clerk of the House cause copies of this order to be published in all the daily and weekly papers of the State until and including Thursday, Jan. 30 next.

In the House this order was read and passed.

In the Senate, read twice by the Chair, and passed in concurrence.

were presented, and on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills, were referred to the following committees:

Judiciary

By Mr. Dearth of Penobscot, An Act to amend Section 26 of Chapter 70 of the Revised Statutes relating to the time of payment of legacies. (Tabled, on motion by the same senator, and ordered printed)

By the same senator, An Act to amend Section 4 of Chapter 72 of the Revised Statutes relating to the appointment of guardian to married persons. (Tabled, on motion by the same senator, and ordered printed)

Pensions

By Mr. Davies of Cumberland, Resolve in favor of Susan E. Dumphe, widow of Charles Dumphe, late of Company G, 6th Regiment of Infantry, Maine Volunteers, Civil War.

Railroads and Expresses

By Mr. Peacock of Washington. An Act to establish the Lubec. East Machias and Machias Railway Company.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Davies of Cumberland, An Act to amend Section 45. Chapter 117 Revised Statutes 1916, relating to the salaries of clerks in the office of register of probate for Cumberland county.

Temperance

By Mr. Davies of Cumberland, Resolve for the appointment of a committee and for an appropriation of \$200 for the purpose of celebrating the glorious victory for the national prohibition amendment. (Tabled, on motion of the same senator and 500 copies ordered printed)

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Ames of Washington, Resolve in favor of the town of Addison for improvement of road leading from the State highway in Columbia Falls to the town of Jonesport.
