SENATE

Thursday, January 23, 1919.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. C. D. Boothby of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: H. D. No. 11, Resolve proposing an amendment to Section 11 of Part 3 of Article V of the Constitution, and providing for the election of the Attorney General by the people.

In the House referred to the committee on judiciary.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Thornton of Aroostook, tabled and 500 copies ordered printed, pending reference in concurrence.

The following bills, resolves, etc., were presented, and on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills, were referred to the following committees:

Agriculture

By Mr. Chick of Kennebec, An Act to amend the apple packing law, Chapter 36, Revised Statutes.

By the same senator, An Act to amend Section 36, Chapter 36, R. S., relating to hearings in case of violation of the apple packing law.

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Gannett of Kennebec, Resolve in favor of Maine Children's Home Society, for maintenance.

By the same senator, Resolve in favor of the Augusta General Hospital for maintenance.

Claims

By Mr. Parent of Androscoggin, Resolve in favor of Francois X. Bel-leau of Lewiston, in the county of Androscoggin.

Education

By Mr. Folsom of Somerset, Petition of Albert B. Clark and 19 others, relating to interest on wild land school funds.

Interior Waters

By Mr. Clement of Waldo, An Act to amend Section 32 of Chapter 33 of the Revised Statutes of 1916, relative to mill waste deposited in lakes and ponds.

Judiciary

By Mr. Cobb of Kennebec, An Act to repeal Chapter 192 of the Public Laws of the State of Maine, for 1917, entitled An Act to amend Sections 4, 5 and 7 of Chapter 95 of the Revised Statutes, in relation to mortgages of real estate.

By Mr. Deering of York, An Act to incorporate the city of Saco.

By Mr. Gurney of Cumberland, An Act to amend Sections 49, 51, 53, 54, 55, 59 and 60, and to repeal Sections 50 and 52 of Chapter 64 of the Revised Statutes relating to the protection of children, as amended by Chapter 237 of the Public Laws of 1917. (1000 copies ordered printed.)

Legal Affairs

By Mr. Thombs of Penobscot, An Act to establish a superior court in the county of Penobscot. (500 copies ordered printed.)

By Mr. Parent of Androscoggin, An Act to amend Section 2 of Chapter 194 of the Private and Special Laws of 1915, amending the act establishing a municipal court for the city of Auburn.

By the same senator, An Act to amend Chapter 636 of the Private and Special Laws of 1871, establishing a municipal court for the city of Lewiston.

By Mr. Gurney of Cumberland, An Act to amend Section 14 of Chapter 65 of the Revised Statutes, relating to divorce.

Library

By Mr. Gordon of York, Resolve to appropriate money for the purchase of History of York.

Military Affairs

By Mr. Googin of Androscoggin, Resolve appropriating money for the erection and equipment of a State armory for the use of the National Guard of the State of Maine stationed in the city of Lewiston.

Public Utilities

By Mr. Lord of York, An Act to amend Section 1 of Chapter 145 of the

Public Laws of Maine for the year A. D. 1917.

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Clement of Waldo, Resolve in favor of aid in repairing highway in the town of Knox.

By Mr. Gannett of Kennebec, Resolve to appoint a committee to inquire into the advisability of purchasing the residence of the late James G. Blaine or some other suitable property for an executive mansion. (Adopted and sent down for concurrence.)

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Tuttle of Aroostook, S. D. No. 27, Resolve in favor of Westmanland Plantation for the payment of school funds forfeited for failure to file returns, tabled for printing, was taken from the table, and on further motion by the same senator was referred to the committee on claims, in non-concurrence, and sent down for concurrence.
