SENATE

Tuesday, January 28, 1919.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. William R. Wood of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House: An Act relating to schooling in unorganized territory.

In the House this bill was referred to the committee on education.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Walker of Somerset, tabled and 500 copies ordered printed, pending reference in concurrence.

The following bills, resolves, etc., were presented and on recommendation of the committee on reference of bills, were referred to the following committees:

Appropriations and Financial Affairs

By Mr. Baxter of Sagadahoc, Resolve in favor of the Bath City hospital.

By Mr. Grant of Cumberland, Resolve in favor of the Children's Heart Work Society, Portland, for the care, support and education of neglected or dependent children, whose parents or grandparents are unable and whose relatives are unwilling to properly support and maintain them.

Indian Affairs

By Mr. Ames of Washington, petition of George Dana and eight others of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians.

Salaries and Fees

By Mr. Dearth of Penobscot, An Act to amend Section 37 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes, in relation to the salary of the county attorney of Penobscot county.

Ways and Bridges

By Mr. Baxter of Sagadahoc, Resolve, appropriating money to aid in maintaining a ferry across Merry-meeting bay in the county of Sagadahoc.

By Mr. Ames of Washington, Re-

solve, in favor of the town of Harrington, Washington county.

Reports of Committees

Mr. Thombs, from the committee on legal affairs, on An Act to incorporate the York Beach Chamber of Commerce, S. D. No. 4, reported same ought not to pass.

The report was accepted and sent down for concurrence.

Mr. Tuttle, from the committee on agriculture, on An Act to amend the apple packing law, Chapter 36 of the Revised Statutes, reported same be printed and returned to the committee.

The report was accepted.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Lewis of Lincoln the following bills, tabled for printing, were taken from the table and on further motion by the same senator were referred to the committee on sea and shore fisheries in concurrence:

An Act to repeal so much of the Revised Statutes and Acts amendatory thereof as relate to the granting of lobster licenses.

An Act to render lobster licenses non-revocable.

An Act to repeal Chapter 75 of the Private and Special Laws of 1915, entitled "An Act to prohibit fishing for herring in Sheepscot river and its tributaries by use of seines or nets within 2000 feet of any trap or weir."

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair desires to state that the Hon. Charles J. Hutchins has been appointed, under a general order of the House and Senate, an assistant to members in drafting bills, and will also have charge of the second reading of bills on the part of the Senate, and the third reading of bills on the part of the House. He will be located with his committee in Room 58, which is the State land agent's private office. This is for the information of the members.
