Tuesday, January 13, 1925. The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer was offered by the Rev.

Mr. Fenn of Augusta.

Journal of previous session read and approved.

From the Senate: Report of the Joint Special Committee on telephone service for the Legislature reporting the following order and that

it "Ought to pass":

ORDERED, The House concurring, that free telephone service be provided for each member of the Senate and House to the number of fifty (50) calls, of reasonable duration, from Augusta to points within the limits of the State of Maine, and that each member of the Senate and House be provided with a card to be certified to by the Secretary of State or his Deputy; the cost of this service to be paid to the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company at regular tariff rates.

In the Senate report read and accepted and order read and passed.

The following bills and resolves were received and were referred to the committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs when that committee shall have been appointed:

By Mr. Wing of Auburn: An act to amend Sections 85, 86, 87 and 88 as amended by various public laws of Chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes relating to the State Auditor.

By the same gentleman: Resolve in favor of the Governor and Council. Judiciary (When appointed)

By Mr. Oakes of Portland: An act to amend Chapter 6 of the Revised relating to nominations. Statutes (1000 copies ordered printed).

By the same gentleman: An act relating to the limitation of buildings in specified districts of cities and towns. (1000 copies ordered printed).

By the same gentleman: Resolve proposing an amendment to the Constitution authorizing the limitation of buildings according to their use or construction to the specified districts of cities and towns.

It appearing to the House of Representatives that the following is an important question of law and occasion a solemn one-

Ordered: the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court are hereby requested to give to the House of Representatives, according to the provisions of the Constitution in this behalf, their opinion on the following

question, to wit:

Whereas, a Bill has been introduced into the House of Representatives providing for the limitation of buildings in specified districts of cities and towns, which bill is in form similar to that recommended by an Advisory Committee appointed by the Secretary of Commerce of the United States for legislation of the various states, and

Whereas, the question of the power of a legislature to enact laws limiting buildings according to the terms of said Act under the Constitution of this State has been raised and an amendment to the Constitution pertaining to the same is be-fore the House of Representatives: QUESTION 1.

Has the Legislature the right and authority under the Constitution to enact a law according to the terms of the following Bill which is annexed to the order?

"Bill an Act relating to the limitation of Buildings in Specified Districts of Cities and Towns."

Papers from the Senate Out of Order

From the Senate: Ordered, the House concurring, that all committees are hereby directed to report to the committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs all appropriations and money recommended by them, and any acts or resolves recommended by them which amend existing statutes or resolves requiring an appropriation of money.

The committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs is hereby directed to make a record of such reports and forthwith submit the same to the Legislature for changes therein

No act or resolve involving an appropriation of money shall be engrossed without having endorsed thereon, in addition to the usual endorsements of the officers of the Senate and House, the following, namely: "Examined and recorded by the committee on appropriations and financial affairs. Chairman."

House concurring, that the Superintendent of Public Buildings is hereby given charge of all assignments of rooms for hearings in the Capitol building, and that all applications for rooms for hearings must be made to him in writing 48 hours previous to the time when such rooms are to be used for that purpose.
